# CLERGY CORNER

WITH RABBI & CANTOR

## The Season of Our Freedom

**D**ear OST Family,  
Beginning Saturday evening, March 27, we will recite the well known passage from the Haggadah, "B'chol dor v'dor," "In every generation each of us is required to see ourselves as if we, ourself, went out from Egypt." In other words, the Torah commands us to re-enact the story of our people's exodus as if we had been among those enslaved who escaped the Pharaoh's horsemen and chariots. Why? Why do we have to re-live the bitterness and the tears of slavery, the blood on the lintels of our doors and the terror of the angel of death, the waters threatening to drown us ahead while Pharaoh's army closed in from behind?

The answer is both practical and simple. Without experiencing slavery for ourselves, we are unlikely to appreciate the blessings of our freedom. How many of us focus on the one little negative in our lives when we have so much more for which to be grateful? How many of us fill our lives with so much busyness that we never take time to figure out what really brings us joy and to do those things or to spend time with the people we love? How many of us are so focused on our bodies we ignore the life of our spirits or so focused on what is on our minds that we let our bodies go entirely? How many of us put off our hopes and dreams, when they are ours for the taking and making now?

Passover is *Z'man Cheruteinu*, the Season of our Freedom, also known as *Chag Ha'Aviv*, the Festival of Spring, when our world is born anew. Both we and the earth have the opportunity to sow seeds of renewal and hope. It is no wonder that in the Torah, *Nisan*, the month during which *Pesach* falls, was considered the first month of the year rather than *Tishrei* in which our High Holidays take place. What better time to celebrate the New Year than with the advent of Spring?!

This year, we could lament not being able to gather together in person around our holiday tables. Or we could rejoice in the Zoom Seders we will share that will allow so many more of our friends and loved ones to celebrate our freedom with us!

We had hoped we would be at OST by this spring, but, for all of our safety, we will once again hold our Zoom second Seder on **Sunday, March 28th at 6 pm.**

We're updating last year's Haggadah and have some fun surprises in store. It may not look like what we thought it would, but we will still know the myriad blessings of acknowledging our redemption from slavery and the many gifts of our freedom, not the least of which are the various incarnations of the COVID-19 vaccine. So during this joyous season, may each of us commit to our own rebirth, to that of our families, our congregation, our community and world and may we truly be able to say, "Next Year at OST!"

## Our First Anniversary

**M**id-March marks one year since life at Ohef Sholom dramatically shifted from aiming for large gatherings to nearly none at all.

It's been one year of the COVID-19 pandemic.

It's been one year of facing enormous challenges in nearly everything we do.

It's also been a year of meeting head on and overcoming those challenges through innovation, imagination, and tenacity.

It's been a year of profound loss.

And, it's been a year when we've found new ways to express empathy.

It's been a year of extremes – of turning lemons into lemonade – and some of us might say, making the best lemonade we've ever had.

It's been a balancing act.

While we miss our Shabbat services in the chapel with our wonderful clergy, music director, and choir, followed by our Onegs, we're excited by how many congregants and friends attend our services by logging onto OST's website or Facebook page. And, since our streaming and digital capabilities are now integral to our congregation, upgrading and maintaining them will be essential going forward.

In one year, we have grown as a congregation, and through the Internet, we have increased our reach, comforting, teaching, and praying with congregants and friends from Oregon to Florida, from Ohio to California.

This has been a year of newfound and expanded connection. We're more than surviving – in myriad ways, we're thriving.

At the one-year mark, this pandemic isn't behind us. If the past 12 months are any indication, however, there's virtually nothing that Ohef Sholom Temple can't accomplish. . . especially if we work together and support each other.

This is not an anniversary to celebrate, but it is one to be grateful for.

## Is Glitter Good to Eat?

Many products that we need are prepackaged eliminating our choices. Others are not and allow us the opportunity to make better environmental choices. Glitter is one of those choices. We probably all love the sparkle and shine that it adds to product design, cards, objects, craft projects, and celebrations but what are the long-term effects of it.

Glitter is a PET (polyethylene terephthalate) plastic that is also used in many plastic drink bottles. Glitter is made from tiny pieces of the PET plastic that are colored. In the end a lot of it ends up on the ground and eventually in the oceans and lakes. Wastewater treatment plants are not capable of removing these small pieces (especially as they break down further in the water). Most of the tiny pieces along with plastic microbeads end up in sludge that sinks to the bottom during the water purification process or remains in the water after cleaning. This sludge is applied to farm fields for fertilizer. The small pieces of plastic are washed back into the streams, lakes, rivers, and oceans. Other pieces that littered the ground are washed by the rain back into the water system.

Why does this matter? It matters because the sea animals that clean the water like oysters and certain fish ingest the glitter. It can block their digestive system and cause them to starve to death. It also matters because we end up eating these tiny pieces when we ingest these animals and their predators or in our drinking water.

There is a way to help with this problem. By choosing not to buy things that have glitter or not using glitter we can each help in our own way to improve our precious earth's environment.

Glitter and BPA are not part of a healthy diet and may negatively affect our endocrine system. Research is ongoing.

### How Do I Prepare My Home for Passover?

It is customary to clean the home prior to Passover to find all of the pesky *chametz* (leavened bread) that might be hiding. The *bedikat chametz*, or the hunt for leavened bread, can be a fun activity for quarantined little ones (or adults)! Play hide and seek with some bread, crackers, or cereal. If you have a fireplace, you can further engage in this tradition by building a fire to burn the *chametz* you discover. Also, keep in mind that non-perishable items can be donated to a local food bank.

### What Goes on the Seder Plate?



**Maror (bitter herbs)**  
usually horseradish, this is a reminder of the bitter lives of the Hebrew slaves



**Chazeret (bitter herbs)**  
usually romaine lettuce, this is also symbolic of the bitterness of life in Egypt



**Karpas (greens, usually parsley)**  
represents the spring season in which Passover takes place



**Beitzah (egg)**  
represents the Passover offering of ancient days, as well the wholeness and continuing cycle of life



**Zeroa (shank bone)**  
symbolizes the lamb that was sacrificed in ancient days



**Charoset (mixture of apples, nuts, sweet wine, and sugar or honey)**  
symbolic of the bricks and mortar made by Hebrew slaves



# Chag Sameach!



## Also place on the table:

**Three matzot (plural of matzah)** on a plate, covered with a cloth or napkin cover



**Salt water** - a reminder of the tears shed by Hebrew slaves



**Kos Eliyahu (Elijah's cup, filled with wine)** - a symbol of hope for a redemptive future



**Afikomen bag (bag for broken matzah, to hide)** - this is traditionally hidden during the seder for children to find in exchange for a small gift/prize.



## Optional Additions

**Kos Miryam (Miriam's cup)** - a special cup filled with water to honor Miriam, who played a vital role in our people's history



**Tapuz (orange)** - a symbol of inclusion of the LGBTQ+ community and others who feel marginalized in Jewish life

## NORFOLK EMERGENCY SHELTER TEAM (N.E.S.T.)

Thanks to the generosity of our Temple family and many community partners, we completed OST's Norfolk Emergency Shelter Team (NEST) volunteer week at First Presbyterian Church from January 20-27. During our week, we hosted 315 total guests, with the NEST shelter being at 100% of its 45-person capacity each night. Additionally, we provided meals, hot beverages, bus tickets, and other services to over 100 persons who could not be admitted to the NEST shelter during our week.





Thanks to the hard work and generosity of several Temple families, each guest received a freshly prepared hot meal, hot breakfast, and bag lunch each day at NEST, amounting to over 1200 meals prepared and served. We also relied on numerous volunteers, many of

whom came on multiple nights and early mornings to assist with running the NEST shelter safely, efficiently, and most importantly, in a warm and welcoming manner in accordance with our Jewish values. We are especially thankful for our across-the-street partners at Ghent United Methodist Church who provided volunteers and meals for a night, giving our stalwart volunteers a much-needed break.

We are also thankful for OST members who donated two full car loads of gently used clothing, shoes, and winter items which were delivered to NEST and provided to the guests.

Additionally, we cannot say enough about the generosity of First Presbyterian Church of Norfolk in opening its doors to operate the NEST shelter for the entire 2020-2021 winter season. In addition to sharing its wonderful facilities, First Presbyterian provided nightly leadership and volunteers during our NEST week to provide assistance with serving our guests. The City of Norfolk's NEST organization has also provided vital support this year, including personal protective equipment and other equipment and supplies necessary to safely operate NEST during the COVID-19 pandemic.

While we missed hosting NEST in our beloved Temple building, this was a great chance for OST to strengthen our friendships in the community and shine a spotlight on what our little temple can do, and every Ohef Sholom Temple member should be proud of our Temple's commitment to this important community project. We look forward to serving with NEST in 2021-2022 in whatever form that may take, knowing we have the full support of OST behind us.




### A Recap of Our Paper Midrash Golem Workshop with Isaac & Rabbi Shawna Brynjegard-Bialik
