	staff, volunteers, congregation members, visitors, vendors and contractors are
	not to bring any gun, pistol, bowie knife, dagger or other dangerous weapon
	onto the Temple's grounds or into the Temple. This includes handguns carried
	by persons who have concealed carry permits.
2.	Off-duty Norfolk Police officers are hired for security. They must have Virginia
	Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) certified law enforcement
	certification.

Procedure:	1.	Signs will be permanently posted at all entrances stating, "Norfolk Police patrol
		this facility."
	2.	When police are monitoring security, temporary signs will be posted that state,
		"No guns, knives or other dangerous weapons allowed in the Temple. Bag and
		Concealed Weapons Check-in Progress." These signs will come down after police leave.
	3.	If indicated, bag checks and/or pat downs may be performed by Temple off-duty
		Norfolk Police officers to ensure no weapons are bought onto the Temple's grounds or into the Temple.

- 4. In the event that a weapon is detected, the bearer of that weapon must leave the Temple; dispose of the weapon outside the Temple property; and then, reenter the building or grounds. It is not acceptable to store a prohibited weapon inside a vehicle on Temple grounds.
- 5. If a weapon is detected on the Temple grounds or inside the building, the Temple off-duty Norfolk Police officers will engage the violator, take away the weapon and determine if police intervention is required. If Temple off-duty Norfolk Police officers are not present, the Norfolk police will be called immediately.
