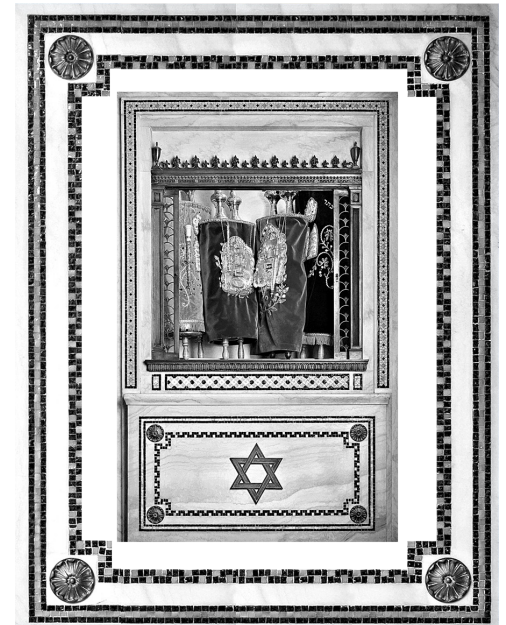

One Small Change Challenge!

Over the summer, we challenge you to make one small change here at OST or at home!

HERE ARE SOME IDEAS!

- Use reusable bags for groceries and produce
- Recycle
- Repurpose clothing and other items
- Walk or ride a bike instead of driving
- Use reusable water bottles and shopping bags
- Switch to CFL light bulbs
- Use less energy by turning off devices and unplugging chargers (Cell phone and other chargers use power when plugged in, even if there is nothing attached to them!)
- Put devices with remotes like TVs, DVD players, and stereos on a power strip and turn it off when you're not using them. These devices use a lot of power to run the remote receiver when the device is off.

Think of all the things we learned on Mitzvah Day, and take the challenge!
