GIFTS THAT KEEP ON GIVING

This year, the 24th of December is . . . the first night of Chanukah. No doubt you are aware of the fast approaching winter holidays because the signs of the season are everywhere these days: ads for toys show up on TV, in shop windows, and throughout your Facebook newsfeed. When you're a parent (or grandparent, or aunt, or aunt-like friend) to kids who have been mentally compiling their Chanukah wish lists since autumn began, it can be difficult not to get swept up in the consumerism that often accompanies the holiday season.

In order to help us make sure that our children understand that gift-giving is more about the giving than the gift, and that gifts need not be material items, Annette Powers, the Director of Communications at Central Synagogue in New York City, has written the following on www.reformjudaism.org (a website I highly recommend for all of your Jewish questions including which way to load and light the Chanukah candles and what blessings accompany the candle lighting each night):

Chanukah, which means "dedication," is a wonderful opportunity to teach that Jewish tradition places great value on the family. Whether we're making latkes together or playing a winner-take-all game of *dreidel*, Chanukah offers wonderful opportunities to spend time with those we love. In that spirit, here are eight ideas for Chanukah gifts that won't collect dust on the shelf and will provide meaningful family experiences and memories for years to come:

1. GO ON A TRIP

What a wonderful way to make life long Jewish memories. Travel doesn't have to be expensive; even a day trip to a local park or a museum can be memorable. If you live in an area with different ethnic communities, a trip to Chinatown or Little Italy, for example, can make a fun "travel" day. Chanukah is a perfect time, too, for a trip to a local Jewish museum or cultural site.

2. PLAN AN EVENT

Taking your kids to a movie, play, or sporting event of their choice can be a bonding experience and give kids something to look forward to and remember well beyond the holiday's end. Round out the day by having your kids pick their favorite place for lunch or dinner, and end with some delicious sufganiyot (jelly-filled donuts) and a game of dreidel at home.

3. BUY A FAMILY MEMBERSHIP

Memberships to museums, zoos, JCCs, and other local attractions and organizations are a great way for families to learn and play together on a regular basis throughout the year.

4. TAKE A CLASS

Education is the gift that keeps giving. Gifting a child a class in one of his or her favorite hobbies, such as dance, karate, art, or music, is an excellent way to encourage interests beyond school.

5. SUBSCRIBE TO A MAGAZINE

Since the advent of email and text messaging, kids rarely get mail anymore. A gift subscription to a magazine that relates to one of their interests will give them something to look forward to in the mailbox every month. Don't forget, we are the people of the book!



Explanation Time as Promised: Those of you who were awake during my speech at the Yom Kippur morning service may recall hearing of how *Ohef Sholom Temple* (along with select area Jewish organizations) has been chosen by the *Tidewater Jewish Foundation* & Massachusetts-based *Harold Grinspoon Foundation* to receive training on how to coordinate our Endowment Campaign, ensuring that Ohef Sholom is here for our children, grandchildren and great-grandchildren.

You may also recall a reference to "Planned Gifts" which are left after you are gone. By this strategy, you can forever make a meaningful impact upon Ohef Sholom Temple for future generations. Not a bad way to leave a Legacy!

Here's a clear reason why: You have 3 possible places to leave money after you die: The IRS, Your Heirs, Your Favorite Charities. You can disinherit one of them but not two. Assuming you would prefer to cut out the Internal Revenue Service, please contact **Scott Kaplan** or **Amy Weinstein** at the *Tidewater Jewish Foundation* or any Temple Board member. They can put you in touch with someone who can explain the benefits.

SIZE DOESN'T MATTER (in this instance)

If our congregation can generate 18 new commitments between now and year-end 2018, the *Harold Grinspoon Foundation* will contribute \$7,500 to *Ohef Sholom Temple*. If we receive 25 Planned Gifts, that number rises to \$10,000. The size of the gift does not matter. Even if you feel you are not wealthy, you can still make a significant impact with a meaningful gift. So what are you waiting for? Please think about your ability to impact the future of our *Ohef Sholom Temple* & our broader Jewish community. My family and I have.

6. ENCOURAGE HOBBIES

If your kid is the arts-and-crafts type, set aside time for a craft night. Google Chanukah craft ideas! If your child is a budding chef, make latkes together by choosing from one of the myriad recipes on the Internet from Zucchini Carrot to Pumpkin Pie. Or if your kid is an aspiring actor, put together a skit about the Maccabees, and perform it at a family Chanukah party (you can get other ideas from the Shalom Sesame Video Series).

7. ENGAGE IN TIKKUN OLAM (REPAIR OF THE WORLD)

Spend an afternoon volunteering together at a local shelter, bringing cheer to home-bound seniors, or sorting through last year's toys to donate to those who are less fortunate. These activities not only will teach kids the importance of giving back and helping others, but also will help them learn by example.

8. GIVE TZEDAKAH (CHARITY)

It's important—and Jewish!—to teach kids that the best gift is the one you give to others. Make sure to carve out time and money to show them how to give to charity. Decide upon a cause that's dear to your family by using www. reformjudaism.org "Social Justice Gift Guide for Hanukkah." Discuss with your kids what kinds of charities matter to them and how much to give so that they feel a sense of ownership and pride when giving tzedakah.

I hope these ideas help you to have a fun, meaningful, and memorable Chanukah that will bring light for years to come.

FAMILY LEARNING

KIDDUSHIN Saturday Morning B'nai Mitzvah Family Sessions

Kiddushin is Hebrew for sacredness that infuses the real world. example is a sense of holiness that comes from a group of 10 OST families that get up early Saturday morning 5 or 6 weeks in a row, drive to Temple by 9 am from Suffolk, Chesapeake, Virginia Beach with their semi-awake child in tow, and their caffeinated selves. Their child is about to become a bar or bat mitzvah this spring, and these sessions are OST prerequisites for a ceremony in the sanctuary or chapel. Families will make the same drive Sunday morning, and invest a significant amount of social, emotional and financial resources to support this Jewish rite of passage into an adult community. Why?

'PARENTS ARE THE GLUE THAT HOLD OUR COMMUNITY TOGETHER.'

Parents of OST's Fall B'nai Mitzvah sessions expressed this sentiment in a class on the bar/bat mitzvah party and celebration. The six Saturday sessions are based on Rabbi Jeffrey K. Salkin's 3rd edition of the popular book, Putting God on the Guest List: How to Reclaim the Spiritual Meaning of Your Child's Bar or Bat Mitzvah. Rabbi Salkin first wrote it

in 2005 to address a disturbing trend in excessive celebrations of a young adolescent's entrance into Jewish adulthood. There is evidence that disturbing secular excesses still exist, but more frequently in other regions of the country. In 2016, parents at Ohef are relieved that the Tidewater region, in contrast to other parts of the country where they have lived, does not create pressure to outspend the mythical Mayerson's in the onegs, meals and parties surrounding the Torah-reading ceremony in the Some children in our sanctuary. community are aware of a budgetary limit to their celebration.

MITZVAH

The 7th grade children meet separately with Cantor Wally on Saturday mornings, while the parents meet with me. They learn with a preteen edition of Putting God on the Guest List. The youth lessons develop their sense of "commandedness" in the bar or bat mitzvah rituals. The Hebrew word mitzvah is not easily translated. It embodies the idea of commandments from a higher power, doing good deeds, and feeling blessed by the responsibility to do

good. In these lessons, our youth come to appreciate the sacredness of our community's expectation that they contribute constructively to our real world in ways unique to their character and Jewish faith.


Their understanding begins with seeing the Torah up-close and personal, un-scrolled, painstakingly hand-written, cherished and protected by our community for many generations. Not only is their bar or bat mitzvah ceremony the culmination of 3-4+ years of Hebrew study, but it is also the commencement of adult accountability for their life-choices and ethical actions in the world.

Parents emphasize that the bar/bat mitzvah weekend gets some of its kiddushin from the rare and loving reunion of extended family from near and far, including Bahrain, Scotland and Canada. Kiddushin also comes from including the young teens' school friends and families who are raised in a different faith, in a way that holistically integrates the teen's Jewish world with the rest of his/her self.

Why does a 13-year-old's Hebrew chanting and interpretation of Torah in our Temple bring together such a rare and powerful force of family across the globe? Why do families make such an unprecedented investment in an adolescent's Jewish coming of age? In a word, *Kiddushin*.

Being a Minority: Chanukah





My name is Michael Jaffe, and I am your Budget Committee Chairman. I have been Chairman of the Membership Committee, and currently I am also a member of the Men's Club, Chairman of the Investment Committee and a member of the Board of Directors.

I am joined on the Budget Committee by President Ted Kaufman, 1st Vice President Karen Fine, Past President Linda Fox-Jarvis, Treasurer Erik Cooper, Jay Legum, Kaufmann Award Winner Lawrence Steingold, Dues Committee Chair Barbara Dudley, Steve Kocen, Ira Steingold and Executive Director Linda Peck. Clearly I am aided in my duties as Chair by an extremely talented, dedicated and intelligent committee.

And exactly for what is the Budget Committee responsible? Essentially we are tasked with making sure our congregation has a solid foundation in which to operate. Just as our wonderful clergy is responsible for the hearts, minds, souls and spirituality of our Congregation, the Budget Committee is responsible for making sure the Temple exists and operates in a manner that will allow it to do so for as long as the Congregation exists.

Knowing what we are responsible for is the easy part. Delivering on the responsibility is much more difficult. Beyond just ensuring we have a building in which to meet and pray, we also want to have a facility that goes beyond just being a building. We want to have a facility that is clean, well maintained, has room for many diverse activities, hosts a top-notch learning facility and offers an array of services such as b'nai mitzvahs, weddings and holiday parties. We want our religious services to be meaningful and to fulfill our spiritual and religious needs. We need security to protect us and our familes while these things all take place. This all requires us to have an excellent Rabbi like Rabbi Roz and a talented cantor like Cantor Wally and wonderful music to support them. We also need a professional staff and are very fortunate to have Linda Peck as Executive Director leading a dedicated team in the office and Chris Kraus leading



our newly invigorated Family Learning Center. Frankly, we have an incredible array of services we offer our Congregation and the community in which we serve, and we are extremely fortunate we all belong to such a preeminent Congregation.

Our challenge, however, and it is a big one, is how do we continue to offer this array of services that meets the demands of our very diverse Congregation without always increasing our dues? Every month the Budget Committee meets to review our current income which comes to us in the way of dues, facility rental fees, and money received from endowments and other gifts. We check this against our projected or budgeted income and then make sure it is in line with what we expected in order to cover the costs of all that we want to offer. This is a constant balancing act and one we all take very seriously. There is great debate every month as to what we can cut if incomes are not at the expected levels or what we can adjust in various areas if perhaps our electric bills are not as high as we thought they might be and where we can then apply those savings. With a budget over \$1 million dollars, I hope you can imagine how many separate line items there are and how many moving parts there are to review every month. It is our sincere desire to continue to offer the most comprehensive set of events and services in Hampton Roads at a cost that makes our Temple an exceptional value.


