WE WELCOME A NEW DIRECTOR OF FAMILY LEARNING & A NEW VISION FOR OST

An old Japanese proverb goes: "A Vision without a Plan is Daydreaming." Ohef Sholom Temple's Long Range Plan developed by Temple President Ted Kaufman envisioned engaging a full-time Educator for our Religious School way back in 2006.

The 2013 Religious School (RS) Strategic Plan called for putting the vision into action. Throughout 2014 Linda Fox-Jarvis and the Executive Committee, with guidance from our Interim Educator Kitty Wolf, worked with the Board and the RS Committee to develop a Job Description and seek Board approval. Linda then appointed a Search Committee in January 2015 with the goal of hiring an

Educator by July 1. Although the search was time sensitive, the Committee agreed, "It will take what it takes. We'll fill the position only when the right person comes along. And we'll know when that happens!"

In addition to hiring an Educator for our Religious School, the Committee sought someone who would address the needs of our youth and their parents beyond the school years. As Ted Kaufman outlined in his message at the recent Annual Congregational Meeting, his term is devoted to Youth Engagement or "Yalldenu," which translates as "Our Youth." This echoed the theme of the 2014 URJ Biennial: Youth Begins with YOU.

A Word from the Rabbi

APPLYING MIDRASHIM TO OUR STORY

The people finally leave Egypt. They do not travel very far before they are nearly overtaken by Pharaoh and his army.

We read of this famous scene describing the Israelites standing at the shore of the Sea of Reeds, fearful again for their lives. Everyone knows the story. God of course splits the sea and the people travel through. The Egyptian army is drowned in the sea.

There are two midrashim about this event and the questions about miracles that it raises. The first is a modern midrash.

1. Even though the splitting of the sea was a great and wondrous miracle, some people still only saw the mud beneath their feet. They never looked up. They only saw the mud dirtying their sandals. The lesson is clear. There are many miracles all around us, but sometimes we only see the mud.
2. According to an ancient midrash, God did not bring this miracle immediately. God waited until the people demonstrated their faith. And the people waited for one person, a man named Nachshon. It was he who was responsible for God's miracle. How? He jumped into the waters. Only until the waters covered his mouth did God finally split the sea. Thus you have to have faith. You have to jump in head first if you really want to see miracles.

Following this miracle at the sea, Miriam led the people in celebration on the other side. There was singing and dancing. The most important lesson is that the Torah continues after this portion. It does not stop on the other side with this great celebration. The journey continues. The people did not stop with a great celebration. They traveled to Mount Sinai. They wandered through the wilderness.

If we are going to apply this lesson to our own times it occurs to me that we place too much emphasis on celebrations and milestones. We should focus instead on the journey. I am not suggesting that I don't like a good party. I certainly do. But the central focus should not be the ceremony. If we are talking about b'nai mitzvah it should not be about how many verses a student chants, or how well the bar/bat mitzvah sermon is crafted. Instead it should be about the process of learning. What values did s/he learn as s/he prepared for this day?

What would happen if birthday parties were not about "Wow, I am 50 years old" but instead about "This is what I have learned in my 50 years." Then we would not wake up the next day depressed that the party is over (or hung over). Instead we would say, "This what I hope to learn in my next 50 years." What would happen if come Monday the Super Bowl was not about the winner but instead about the season—of each and every team, and about the hopes for next year's season? Will the Giants' sense of family be as profound if they lose the big game?

I know. I am being overly idealistic. But the lesson is important to remember. The lesson is not to focus on the milestones and instead about the journey.

The Hasidic rebbe, Rabbi Ohrbach offers this comment: "This is an indication of what happens so often when one's striving for a certain goal is finally realized. As long as one is striving, the goal is something greatly desired. However, once one has realized the goal, it seems to shrink in importance. The mundane reality of everyday life dissolves all the beautiful dreams, and one realizes all the problems that still lie ahead."

Life is not about the parties and celebrations. It is instead about the journey, the wandering, the trip, the striving. The poet Robert Browning said: "A man's reach must exceed his grasp/ Or what's a heaven for?" Thus keep on striving, keep on journeying and even wandering. And always be like Nachshon. Have the courage to jump in the waters.

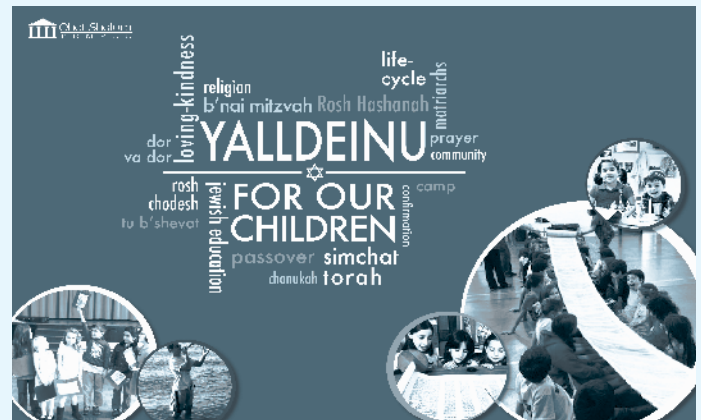


Shalom Y'all,

Last month, you learned that, despite all our efforts, our Religious School enrollment is down from the turn of the millennium. The Good News is that we remain the largest and most vibrant Religious School in Southeastern Virginia. Our Children deserve the best in Reform Jewish education that we can offer them. These obvious reasons have been addressed in our Religious School Long Range Plan, since they represent our future, and were presented to the Board of Directors last year by Karen Fine, our Religious School Committee Chair, and now our 2nd Vice President.

Thank you, Karen, and your Co-Chair, Sandy Forte, for the Dedication and Excellence of your work. I look forward to implementing your plan. The key recommendation of Karen's plan demanding Board action was the creation of Temple Director of Family Education. Unanimously approved by our Board of Directors in January, this position will direct a 21st century religious educational curriculum for our children from Kindergarten, though B'nai Mitzvah, past Confirmation and all the way until they leave for College.



Confirmation is not the Finalé of religious education. Rather, it is the beginning of each Jew's Heroic Adventure. Our Ohef Sholom Temple Youth (OSTY) and Junior Ohef Sholom Temple Youth (JOSTY) comprise an essential NAV system for that journey. I am proud to hear Kitty Wolf say that Ohef Sholom has the 3rd largest number of Madrachim (student helpers) of all Reform Synagogues in the country. Many thanks to Kitty Wolf! What we need is an invigorating curriculum for them to teach, and our Middle School needs it most urgently.

That's why I am happy to announce that Christopher E. Kraus, the current Director of Lifelong Learning at Temple Sholom in Cincinnati, will be joining us as our new Director of Family Learning. Our Search Committee and Board of Directors believe Chris is the right person to spearhead our Religious School toward a 21st Century curriculum and provide the necessary Re-structuring it requires. He and his lovely wife Bari, an Early Childhood Education Consultant, will be relocating to our area this July. After 46 years in Cincinnati, they have finally found a way to come to Virginia to be near family. I know each of you will welcome Chris & Bari and provide them with all the support you can. Remember when you first relocated or came back to Hampton Roads.

Together as a Congregational Family, we will accomplish these goals.

OST PLANS NEW HANDICAPPED-ACCESSIBLE BATHROOM

OST's Special Needs & Security Committee, formed in 2013 and co-chaired since then by Jim Schloss and Jerry Golden, is committed to making our Temple safe, secure and accessible to all. While our bathrooms are "in compliance" with American Disabilities Act (ADA) standards, we decided to hold ourselves to a higher standard when we learned that our bathrooms were not completely accessible to our wheelchair-bound congregants and guests. There are many issues with our men's and women's bathrooms that prevent or restrict their use by disabled and aging persons ranging from width of doors and the aisles, size of stalls, to even the weight of the entry doors.

The Special Needs Committee turned to the House Committee to find the space and design for a handicapped-accessible bathroom. OST congregant and architect Drew Gebler generously donated his time to design plans to convert the maintenance closet (currently located in the women's bathroom) into a unisex handicapped-accessible bathroom with access from Simon Hall. We are currently finalizing the plans, which will

include a power-operated door, and obtaining cost proposals with the goal of having this bathroom completed in time for Rosh Hashanah.

Since we are unable to absorb the cost of this bathroom in our current budget, we must turn to the generosity of our donors within our congregation. We have received seed money from **Jack and Beverly Fox** to fund this project, as well as generous donations from **Jim & Sarah Schloss, David & Lisa Cohen**, and the **Estate of Iris Pincus**. With over half of the necessary funding raised, we hope to start on the renovation very soon.

If you can contribute to this important project, we would be truly grateful. No donation is too small. Having a dedicated handicapped-accessible restroom will truly make our Temple a "House of Prayer for All Peoples."

"Having a child with a disability since the age of 15 who currently 'lives' in a wheelchair has made me aware of the obstacles faced every day by someone who is physically challenged. Simple things that we all take for granted are sometimes insurmountable – i.e. dealing with curbs and stairs, opening a door, and yes, going to the bathroom. I am so proud of OST for stepping up to the plate and making this bathroom a reality. I thank the Special Needs and Security Committee and House Committee for their hard work and perseverance on this project."

As a pianist, Mr. Woodward is a frequent collaborator in both vocal and instrumental chamber concerts, having performed with the Virginia Arts Festival, Virginia Chamber Players, Virginia Symphony Orchestra, I. Sherman Greene Chorale, Art Song of Williamsburg, and Norfolk Chamber Consort,

among others; at the Phillips Collection (Washington, D.C.), Jordan Hall (Boston), and the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival, and in Germany and Italy. In April 2011, he served as Principal Coach for the premiere of Ricky Ian Gordon's Rappahannock County, a music theater work co-commissioned by the Virginia Opera and Virginia Arts Festival. Mr. Woodward's performances have been heard on American Public Media's Performance Today. A graduate of Northwestern University, Charles Woodward has served on the adjunct music faculties of The College of William and Mary, Old Dominion University, and Christopher Newport University.

We had perfect weather, a great crowd, terrific music, delicious food, and a wonderful time at Woodstockley Gardens, our congregational picnic, on May 9.



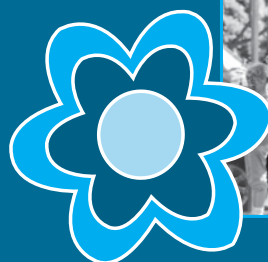
