## A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT



Dear OST Family,

I thought I would write this month with an update on the OST Religious School, as well as share information on the many camping, Israel, and social action opportunities for our youth & young adults this summer.

### RELIGIOUS SCHOOL UPDATE

In both the Temple's long range planning and our Religious School's strategic planning, the need to focus on engaging more young people and families while continuing to meet the needs of an aging congregation was noted. In December 2014, 17 members of the OST Board attended the URJ Biennial in San Diego and heard the message loud and clear, **Youth Begins with You!** It was with renewed vigor that the Board unanimously, and in partnership with our clergy, set as one of our priorities Youth Engagement, and voted to invest in a senior staff person to help us achieve this goal. We are now ready to move forward in the search for a full time Director of Congregational Education with the support of our Board, our Clergy, our interim Educator, and our Religious School Committee.

We have formed a search committee, created a job description, submitted a job listing to NATE (The National Association of Temple Educators) and posted the job on jewishjobs.com. The starting date for this position may be as early as this June; however, we are committed to finding the "right" person and realize this may take time. Kitty will continue as our "interim Educator" until our search is complete. We are excited about this position and what it will mean for our children, youth and families. Our Religious School is the largest Religious School program in the Hampton Roads area. Our school is one, if not THE, most compelling draw for new families, with nearly 200 children enrolled. We are fortunate to have an amazing group of dedicated teachers and volunteers and engaged parents, and we boast a high rate of retention for both post B'nai Mitzvah and post Confirmation students (60%). We are so proud of our over 20 Madrichim (teacher assistants) in the Religious School this year, as well as our active youth group and newly formed junior youth group, OSTY & JOSTY, led by our dedicated advisors Amy & Eliot Weinstein, Andrew Sobol and Dana Leader.

Kitty Wolf stepped in as "interim" Religious School Educator three years ago and has done an amazing job. Just a handful of her contributions include: helping to further implement the "Chai" curriculum which is recommended by the URJ, working with the URJ as a Focused Learning Group as part of URJ's B'nai Mitzvah Revolution Initiative, implementing teacher standards and a fair and consistent pay scale, and adding new programs such as the Special Needs Program with a qualified teacher, and a Modern Hebrew Program with a specialist who visits most classrooms weekly to integrate Hebrew into the curriculum. In addition, Kitty has increased the use of technology in our classrooms utilizing digital Hebrew, multi-media and interactive programs such as Mitkadem. Please thank Kitty when you see her for all she does for our Temple and Religious School AND congratulate her for being recognized at the recent NATE convention for her 40 years of service in Reform Jewish Education.

### CAMPS, ISRAEL TRIPS AND OTHER YOUTH AND YOUNG ADULT PROGRAMS

The URJ (Union of Reform Judaism) has established a priority for our youth called the "Campaign for Youth Engagement." Statistics have shown that our children are more likely to live Jewish lives if they have had an immersion-type Jewish experience such as a camp or travel program and/or participation in Jewish youth groups such as our OSTY and JOSTY. Please encourage your children and young adults to consider getting involved in the opportunities available through the URJ.

There are over 60 programs offered by the URJ for children, teens and young adults which include 16 camps, 10 Mitzvah Corps & Religious Action Center programs, 4 Teen Specialty Programs and 8 Israel programs. The teen specialty programs include Leadership, Jewish Learning, Song Leading and a three week bicycle trip around Lake Michigan. Can you tell that I want to go to one of these camps? In addition, three "inclusion/special needs" camps that I find especially exciting are the URJ Kutz Camp – Mitzvah Corps program, which offers a unique inclusion-based Jewish summer-camping experience for teens (ages 13-19) diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorders (ASD) in Warwick, New York; Camp Chazak, a program of URJ Eisner and Crane Lake Camps, providing a camping experience for participants 9 to 13 years old whose social delays impair their ability to function in a typical camp environment; and Camp Coleman's Chadash program in Georgia for young adults, ages 18-24, with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities, offering a transitional step between our camper aged programs and our adult staff community. Chadash provides vocational training in a supervised work setting along with an opportunity for the participants to join in a wide range of recreational, social, and educational components of camp life in a Jewish setting. There are also 2 new specialty camps - one for sports and one for science and technology. Finally, the Israel programs offered are amazing and include the URJ Keshet Taglit-Birthright Israel trip. These trips are offered year-round, are for 10 days and are absolutely free. Eligible participants need only be Jewish, ages 18-26 and seeking a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to explore Israel. Applications are being accepted now for this program, and Congregation Presidents can facilitate acceptance with a recommendation. Please email me if you have an interest in the URJ Keshet trips, and for additional information go to [www.gokeshet.org](http://www.gokeshet.org). Please note that there are separate trips for 18-22 versus 22-26 year olds.

For more information on these programs please email the Temple office. We can also put you in touch with fellow congregants whose children have attended some of these camps/programs. Finally, but very important, there are **scholarship funds** available for these extracurricular youth activities, from both the camps/programs themselves, as well as from our Temple through the generous donations of Sisterhood, Men's Club, our endowment donors and others. 

## DEBBIE KEELING TO RECEIVE THE 2015 HENRY B. KAUFMANN AWARD

For over 30 years the Ohef Sholom Temple (OST) Men's Club has bestowed the Henry B. Kaufmann Award upon a congregant for outstanding service to the Temple and the community at large. Henry B. Kaufmann, an accountant, was extremely active in Men's Club, Temple budget planning and ushering. Debbie's service to the Temple includes serving as Co-President of Sisterhood for two years with Anne Kramer; chairing our Membership Committee for two years; co-chairing our highly successful Temple Directory for three years with our current President Linda Fox-Jarvis; serving on our Casino Night Fundraising Committee almost since its inception; serving on the Board of the OST Foundation; and regularly participating in and financially supporting OST's Soup Kitchen, the NEST Program, the Tekiah Campaign, the Torah Restoration Project, and the Men's Club's Annual Golf Tournament. In 2008 Debbie received the Kurt Rosenbach Award for outstanding service to OST during her four years on the Board.

In the greater community, Debbie is active on the Crystal Ball for the Cure Committee, which has raised well over a \$1,000,000 to help find a cure for Muscular Dystrophy and ALS, and she served on the Board of Young Audiences. ## Art at the Religious School

At OST Religious School we are fortunate to have two Art specialists who work with our children to enhance and enrich learning and address multiple learning needs with hands-on Art experiences directly related to the curriculum they are studying. Ilene Stein is the Art teacher for preschool through third grade and Burgess Hodges teaches Art to fourth through ninth grades. They are both very talented and dedicated to bringing Art into Jewish Learning. Here are descriptions of their Art classes from each of our teachers.

### DEFINING ART FOR PRE-K – GRADE 3 • ILENE STEIN, INSTRUCTOR

Each art project has a theme, reviewed at the very beginning. Some projects suggest follow-up activities related to the theme. Each project is educational and connected to our curriculum, which includes the study of Jewish holidays and heroes, and over-arching concepts such as Gemilut Chasadim where we look at issues such as respect and caring for ourselves and others by thinking about our actions on a deeper level.

Some projects result in beautifully finished works to display or give away. Others focus on experimentation with different materials and techniques. They are all age appropriate and designed to inspire self-confidence. Our projects include cartooning, vegetable printing, texture rubbings, drawings, sketches, and making menorahs, puppets and portraits.



### ART FOR THE UPPER GRADES • BURGESS HODGES, INSTRUCTOR

Over the last few years I have tried many new projects in art class. The projects are directed less at creating pretty things to take home, and more at developing a creative thought process. We have explored different styles such as: cubism, surrealism, action painting, pure abstraction, and graffiti. Over the years a few projects stand out as most engaging and thought provoking for the students:




**Tallit (tzitzit):** This is the third year that I have worked with the sixth grade to create tallitot for their B'nai Mitzvah. We start by learning to tie tzitzit, including learning their significance and the accompanying prayers. Using tie dye, fabric painting, and fabric applique the students are then tasked with interpreting their parshayot into abstracted images for their tallitot.



**Tally Marks:** The students are challenged to make as many tally marks as they can in a half hour period. Usually by the end of this time they are frustrated (intentionally). We then use the number of marks they made to teach them the significance of six million lives. For instance, the "winner" with 4500 marks, would have had to continue for 28 days to make a mark for every Jewish life lost during the Holocaust.



**Hebrew Name Portraits:** Using photographs of the students, they are asked to explore the ideas of their Hebrew names as a sort of secret identity, something important to them, but not used in everyday life. They must alter their images to express what their Jewish identity means to them.




**Graffiti Wall:** We use our class wall as an exploration of what constitutes art and important Jewish themes. We have used graffiti to explore the ideas of the Matriachs and Patriarchs, Jews by Choice, honoring parents, and Tradition.
