Cantor's Notes

We might start to call this the **Year of the Youth** at Ohef Sholom Temple!

At the most recent Union for Reform Judaism's Biennial in San Diego, we heard URJ President Rabbi Rick Jacobs call for a new **Campaign for Youth Engagement**. We're proud to say that Ohef Sholom Temple's Board of Directors unanimously, and in partnership with our clergy, set Youth Engagement as one of our priorities, and voted to invest in a full-time

senior staff person to help us achieve this goal. With the support of the board, our clergy, our interim Educator, and our Religious School Committee, we are in the process of seeking a Director of Congregational Education.

Recent studies have shown that our children are more likely to live active Jewish lives if they have had an immersive Jewish experience such as a **camp** or **Israel program**, and/or participate in Jewish youth groups such as our temple's Junior and Senior Youth Groups, **JOSTY** and **OSTY**. If your children and grandchildren have not yet taken advantage of membership in our youth groups, please encourage them to come and to get involved!

There are also more than 60 programs that the URJ offers for youth, which includes approximately 16 camps, 10 Mitzvah Corps & Religious Action Center programs for social action, four Teen Specialty Programs and eight Israel Programs. The Reform Movement's leadership camp for 10th-12th graders, Kutz in Warwick, NY, lists many of our active OST members among its proud alumni. Kutz Camp challenges and trains teens to be confident leaders of Song, Torah, Creative Arts, Social Action, Youth Groups, and more. In addition, there is a camp for children with autism and another for children with intellectual and/or developmental disabilities. And, there are two new URJ specialty camps — one for sports in North Carolina, and one for science and technology in Boston (for which Tammy and I will be on Faculty during a week this summer!). The Reform Movement's Israel programs are amazing, and include the URJ Kesher Taglit-Birthright Israel trip. These trips are offered year-round, are for 10 days each, and are absolutely FREE! Eligible participants need only be Jewish, ages 18-26 and seeking a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to explore Israel. Reform Summer Camp and Israel programs afford our kids the chance to bond with Judaism, Israel, and other Reform youth for a lifetime.

There are **scholarship funds** available for these youth activities, from both the camps and programs themselves as well as from our Temple through the generous donations of Sisterhood, Men's Club, our Endowment Funds and others. To make it possible for others to get hooked on Judaism at a young age at camp, you might also consider contributing to our newly established campership fund, named in memory of our beloved member and past president of our Sisterhood, Leslie Legum.

Confirmation is a beautiful service that our Tenth Grade students and our clergy work hard to prepare annually. This year we have a wonderful, talented class of 16 Confirmands who will re-affirm their commitment to Judaism and Torah at a moving ceremony on Saturday, **May 16**. Melodious songs and prayers will be laid between their personal statements. Please come to hear our teens declare what Judaism means to them. They are inspiring.

Lastly, celebrate the idea that youth begins with you at our **Congregational Picnic** on Saturday, **May 9**! We are taking over a section of Stockley Gardens for a two-and-a-half hour celebration of Ohef Sholom Temple. We will begin with awards and thank-yous for our Religious School community, as the school year draws to a close. Then, there will be live music; face painting; a bouncy house; fun portraits; Hawaiian Ice; a relaxation station; and the Men's Club will provide nourishment. We will wrap it up with Havdallah and pet blessings – a sweet way to end the week and the school year.

We have a responsibility to our youth, to give them the encouragement and financial support to keep them involved in Judaism. Express your youthful side and invest in the next generation at Ohef Sholom Temple!

A Word from the President (as of may 3)



שָׁלוֹם יְאַל!

Shalom Y'all,

As you have surmised from the picture, your Ohef Sholom Temple Board of Directors is now under New Management. As such, you may be asking yourselves: "Who is this guy?" Here then is the background of your latest Temple President:

I am the first Ohef Sholom Temple President to be born in the decade of the 1960s and am even younger than **President Obama** (barely). As for my history with OST, I was born into this Temple and still remember my 1st grade Class meeting with **Rabbi Harold Hahn** back in 1968. My family ancestry dates back to the founding of the Jewish Historical & Literary Society in 1844 (the precursor to our synagogue) by **Isaac Hofheimer** (the front man) and **Aaron Goldsmith** (the behind-the-scenes financial backer). Along with Aaron's son-in-law, **Lewis Nusbaum**, these civic-minded individuals are responsible for the establishment of what are today Ohef Sholom and Beth El Temples.

Not only did both my Father and Grandfather serve as our Temple Presidents, but there are 16 other Past Presidents of our congregation to whom I proudly claim relation. That is a long way of saying that I love our Temple. It is a part of the very Fiber of my Being. The Presidency is both a **Sacred Responsibility** and Privilege. I hope to live up to **your expectations**, as well as those of my ancestors and my own, as I serve our Congregation and Community during these next two years.

While my family background is steeped in the German-Jewish traditions of Classical Reform Judaism, I have explored and respect all expressions of our Faith. To that end, I spent two years studying Hebrew, becoming a Bar Mitzvah and reading from the Torah for the first time at the age of 50. While I can read our Hebrew prayers, I don't necessarily daven to them. Similarly, I may wear a tallis (prayer shawl), on the bema when the Torah is opened but choose not to wear a yarmulke (Ask your parents!). Like you, my Judaism is personal, combining our Old Traditions and Modern Sensibilities.

Remarkably, Ohef Sholom has done a **wonderful** job of bridging these Two Realities of Contemporary Life. Yet our congregation still faces many challenges to remain Relevant in today's changing world. While we have done much to increase Adult Education & Programming for all Demographics in our Community, our **Religious School**, long the focus of all of our efforts, has been somewhat neglected. Suffice it to say that in 2015, we find ourselves with **21st century students** trying to learn from a **20th century model**. That is why our main focus for the next two years will be on **re-invigorating** our Religious School's Curriculum & Offerings.

Our Enrollment may be down from the turn of the century. Still we remain the largest and most vibrant Religious School in Southeast Virginia, and as such, our children deserve the best in Jewish education that we can offer them. The reasons, while obvious, since they represent our future, have been addressed in our Religious School Long Range Plan, presented to our Board of Directors last year by Religious School Committee Chair (now 2nd Vice President) Karen Fine. We must adapt our Religious School into the world we currently live in. Our children are already there.
