## 2014 Kurt Rosenbach Award

This year Sandy Forte-Nickenig received the Kurt Rosenbach Award at the 2014 Annual Meeting. This award, created in 2004 by our Board of Directors, honors a board member whose outstanding service and contributions to Ohef Sholom Temple best embody the qualities of leadership and commitment demonstrated by our beloved Kurt Rosenbach.

After joining OST in 1996, Sandy plunged headfirst into temple activities and committee work. She founded our Caring Committee, which is such an integral part of OST today; has served as chairperson of the Worship Committee; is currently serving on the Personnel Committee where she took the lead writing the Personnel Committee charter; and she also currently serves on the Religious School Committee and is chair of the Religious School Strategic Planning Committee. She is an honorary director of the Board.

In her remarks about Sandy, Rabbi Roz noted, "While she is passionate about what she believes in, it is compassion that guides her. She cares about those who are less fortunate, those who are alone or lonely, those who are in need of comfort. She also has a Jewish heart and soul and gleans her wisdom from a lifetime of Jewish learning and experience. She is the epitome of a *mensch*, a good person."

In her comments, Sandy noted that she's learned, "It's not important to be great but to do great things." Congratulations to Sandy for all the great things that she does.

### A Word from the Rabbi

Dear Friends,

Summer can be a wonderful time for relaxation and rejuvenation. I hope you and your families are enjoying some fun in the sun; outdoor activities, which bring you pleasure; the reading of some good books; and any other enjoyable projects you didn't have a chance to get to during the busier, and more stressful, "school" year.

Summertime can also afford us the opportunity to do some reflecting on our lives, as we approach the Hebrew month of Elul when we prepare for our High Holidays. With more space to think and feel, we might begin to ask ourselves some of the more meaningful questions: How am I doing? How's my health? Am I taking good care of myself? What small changes could I make to be a better caretaker of these gifts of my mind, body and spirit I have been given?

Are my relationships fulfilling? What can I do, in devoting greater time and energy, to making them better? How about my work: is it meaningful? If not, how can I make it more so? Or what other activities, perhaps in service to others, can I do to supplement my income-producing work? The same goes for those who are retired: am I feeling fulfilled by the way I spend the free time with which I am now blessed? And I could go on and on . . .

Part of being a Jew is asking these questions of ourselves, taking an annual accounting of the soul (*a cheshbon nefesh*) to determine where we are in our lives and how we might do more to fulfill ourselves and those we love, but also to do our part to better our world and make it more whole. *Teshuvah*, the process of repentance, can be undertaken at any time; but, somehow, this time approaching and during the Ten Days of Awe (*Rosh Hashanah* through *Yom Kippur*) is supercharged with motivation and meaning. Whether we want to or not, whether we admit it or not, we know we need to engage ourselves in this work.

To help us answer some of these existential questions about the meaning of our lives, we are fortunate to be welcoming **Rabbi and Dr. Jonathan K. Crane to Ohef Sholom on Friday, September 5, at 6:30 p.m.** A quick Google search of his name will yield much information about Dr. Crane, the Raymond F. Schinazi Junior Scholar of Bioethics and Jewish Thought at Emory University's Center for Ethics. He is visiting our community for a program the evening before at ODU, which is being co-sponsored by The Maimonides Society of the United Jewish Federation of Tidewater, Bon Secours Health System and ODU's Institute for Jewish Studies and Interfaith Understanding. September 4, is the first of three sessions on End of Life Issues that Dr. Crane will take part in along with equally renowned Christian ethicist, Dr. Gerard Magill, Vernon F. Gallagher Chair for the Integration of Science, Theology, Philosophy, and Law, in the Center for Healthcare Ethics at Duquesne University in Pittsburgh, PA.

In addition, during Shabbat services September 12, 19 and 26, we will be having our well-loved *Teshuvah* speaker series, where members of our congregation share their journeys to Judaism with us.

I hope you will join us during all these *Shabbatot* to prepare yourselves for the High Holidays. In the meantime, enjoy your summer to its fullest!

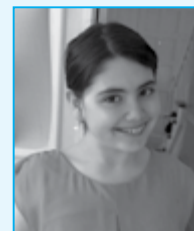

## WORSHIP COMMITTEE

### *Mishkan T'filah* (Dwelling Place of Prayer)

Dear Fellow Congregants:

Rabbi Roz, Cantor Wally and Rabbi Steinberg, with the Worship Committee's support, have initiated a trial use of the newest Reform siddur, prayer book, *Mishkan T'filah*. They will pilot it during Shabbat morning services **August 9** and Friday evening services **August 29**.

While different from what we are accustomed to in format, *Mishkan T'filah* creates both an atmosphere of familiarity, while at the same time allowing for diversity and continuing the tradition of innovation that is so much a part of Reform Judaism.

The reasons for considering this new prayerbook are two-fold. Unlike *Gates of Prayer*, which contains only two options for worship, *Mishkan T'filah* offers the possibility of great variety; it contains many beautiful and meaningful new prayers, yet continues the use of prayers that are also familiar and beloved to us. Also, *Mishkan T'filah* has become the Reform movement's *siddur* of choice in the vast majority of 900 URJ congregations; familiarizing ourselves with the prayer book will allow us and our children to feel comfortable when visiting other temples, at Jewish summer camps, in college and beyond, as well as a part of a larger worldwide movement.

Please be patient, give yourself time to adapt to the new format, familiarize yourself with the prayers and commentaries, and allow yourself to find joy in the discovery of the new. We will be asking for your feedback.

The title *Mishkan T'filah* comes from *Exodus* 25:8. God commands the people Israel to build a portable sanctuary: ***“And let them build Me a sanctuary that I may dwell among them.”*** We hope that this *siddur*, in addition to our familiar *Gates of Prayer*, will continue to make Ohel Sholom a sacred place for you.

## Admission Tickets
