## CLERGY CORNER



### Cantor's Notes

#### Magic & Memory

Jewish overnight summer camp is a magical place for me and for my family. Experiences at the camps I grew up at helped me discover Judaism in a living way, that spoke to me personally, and moved me to make being Jewish a part of my everyday life. Camp is a place where you can "reinvent" yourself and experiment with who you are and what role you play within a group. Tammy and I always say we each like who we are best when we're at camp. We've seen this in our children and in the congregants we've attended camps with as well.

Now that I've been on staff at camps (for more than three times longer than I was a camper), I get a big kick out of helping create Magical Jewish Moments for others. I like to take the way that I'm filled up with Jewish Living at the camps and help create those moments for campers, staff, and also our members here at Ohef Sholom Temple.

Here are some of the moments of magic, and hopefully memory, that the campers and I will take with me from my stays this summer at Camps Airy and Louise, and URJ Kutz Camp:

- Concerts with liberal Jewish Rock Stars Josh Nelson and Dan Nichols
- Our Jewish kids going into Manhattan and getting to visit such important places as the Jewish Museum and Hebrew Union College - Jewish Institute of Religion (where Tammy and I studied, along with Rabbi Roz, in the mid-90s)
- Channa peer-leading a song session after weeks of training
- Micah leading an impromptu song session for his bunk on campout
- Becoming the kind of parents who wait with bated breath for the day's upload of camp pictures -- not only of our kids, but also OST members and others from the Hampton Roads Jewish community
- International staff becoming a part of the camp community - Israelis, Brits, Hungarians, and so many others
- Watching the Camper Musical participants present a preview for us: "Oliver" in Concert
- Bringing a group of junior leaders to the infirmary to serenade a camper with "Lean On Me"
- Friday Night campfires where we sang a dozen spirited Jewish songs, including Oseh Shalom and Shalom Rav, with amazing gusto
- Micah's classmate from Hebrew Academy of Tidewater, a first-time camper, saying to us: "Thanks for introducing me to this place! I really like it here!"
- Staying up until 4:00 am because the program we were writing was almost done but could be just a little better...

There were a few more outstanding moments this summer I had a part in planning. Together in one ceremony, we retired a US Flag, buried old prayerbooks, and showed the camp a Fire Sign, an Israeli custom. We worked with an Eagle Scout on staff to develop the Flag retirement. He had seen a ceremony where the Flag was taken apart, stripe by stripe and star by star, and the colonies or states they stood for were read aloud as the parts were placed into a campfire. We incorporated that symbolism into the ritual, and asked campers each to carry a piece, which they held over their hearts. I adapted a prayer book burial ceremony I had received from a colleague, and as part of the service we planted a fruit tree over the books as we buried them. Simanei Eish, Fire Signs, are made by securing two poles in the ground a good distance apart, stringing wire between them, and attaching shapes made of twisted wire and burlap soaked in kerosene to the suspension wire. Then the shapes are set on fire to reveal a symbol or word. We recruited the Israeli staff members to create the sign. At the end of the ceremony, as we sang a beautiful song led by a counselor choir, the word SHALOM in Hebrew letters lit up the evening sky (and the faces of the campers) in bright flames. All in all, we involved more than 100 participants in the service.

I also guided the creation of a new weekday prayer book for the camp and led the daily morning service, which was a wonderful experience for me as well as for the participants.

And, a very special project for me was guiding the 11th graders in the writing of a song for an ill child (profile provided by the wonderful Mitzvah organization, Songs of Love) and presenting the song to the entire camp, who sang the chorus while we recorded it.

We work hard during our time at camp, but it's really good work, it's very rewarding, and we can't wait to share with you some more of the insights we've gained by being privileged to be there. Camp is magic, and I'm so glad to share it with the campers and with you!

## Our Religious School *is Moving Forward*

## WHAT'S UP *at The Religious School Committee?*

### The Religious School Relief Fund

**What is it? What purpose does it serve? How can YOU help?**

In the words of our beloved Rabbi Roz, *"Each of us is deeply committed to instilling the values of decency, responsibility, loyalty, and faith in our children in the best way we know how- through compelling, meaningful, and inspiring Jewish education."* In response to this commitment, the Religious School Relief Fund was established a few years ago. Its main purpose is to provide "scholarship" monies to religious school families in order to insure that all the children of OST receive the best Jewish learning experience possible.

Scholarships to religious school students are partially funded by the Stern and Kesser Funds, which distribute 4.25% of the principal to scholarship, totaling about \$800 each year. Yet, in the past few years, scholarship requests have increased considerably, due in large part to challenging economic times. Over the past 3 years scholarship requests have averaged around \$4,500 per year. Where does the rest of the money come from?

The remaining funds for scholarships are provided by the Religious School Relief Fund. Without a dedicated source of funding, the Relief Fund relies on contributions from fundraising efforts and direct donations. While the Relief Fund has been able to meet the demand for increased scholarship monies over

the past few years, the Fund is always in need of replenishment... in other words, donations.

With the new school year approaching quickly, economic recovery continuing to be slow, and the reality of unexpected financial difficulties that can befall any of us, the Religious School Relief Fund is essential. By providing tuition assistance to Religious School families it ensures that we can follow through on our commitment of providing a quality Jewish learning experience to all who seek it.

**How can you help? The biggest way we all can help is through direct donations to the Religious School Relief Fund.** So when thinking of a way to honor a family member, teacher or friend... or when celebrating a holiday, birthday, Bar or Bat Mitzvah or other lifecycle event, consider making a gift to the Religious School Relief Fund, a gift of Jewish learning!

## *Admission Tickets*

OST will mail tickets about two weeks prior to *Rosh Hashanah* to congregants who are current in their financial obligations to the Temple through the September 2013 quarter. Envelopes will be marked "High Holy Days."

Children past high school age and up to 24 years of age will not receive admission tickets unless parents fill out a request and mail it to the Temple Office. Upon request, and without charge, dependents who reside in a member's household will receive admission tickets. Tickets will be mailed in September. (Please fill out the enclosed Guest Request Form Enclosed and return to the Temple.)

Admission tickets are not required for the **Yom Kippur Afternoon Study Session** (led by **Rabbi Steinberg**) and for the **Afternoon Memorial and Concluding services**.

## *Which Service Should I Attend?*

It is suggested that families with children in grades 4 - 8 attend the **6:15 p.m. and the 9:00 a.m. Services** (an evening and morning Children's Service will run concurrently for children in K-3rd grade).

The **8:15 p.m. and 11:30 a.m. Services** are suggested for families whose youngest child is in the 9th grade or above, for couples without children, or for single members.

In order to reinforce what our students are learning in Religious School, both in preparation for their B'nai Mitzvah and to be comfortable in their college *Hillels* and any synagogue in which they may find themselves later in life, during the early services the *v'Ahavta*, *Avot* and *Gevurot* will be chanted in Hebrew.

## *Children's Service*

The Children's Worship Service, conducted by Rabbi Steinberg, Religious School Educator Kitty Wolf, and Staff, is designed for children in K-3rd grade. The service will be held in the Chapel and will run concurrently with the **6:15 p.m. and the 9:00 a.m. Services** in the Sanctuary. All adults attending the service are urged to set an example for the children by observing the service and helping the children to refrain from talking or other disruptive behavior.

## *Guests*
