CLERGY CORNER



A Word from Rabbi Steinberg

Animal Cruelty, Pet Safety & Jewish Law

In recent weeks the news media has presented us with stories about dogs, cats, deer, and many other animals. Some were lovely tales about human lives saved, some about the quality of life enhanced, and, sadly, some were about cruelty and mistreatment. As you watched or read about these stories, have you wondered about Judaism's attitude regarding the welfare of our pets

and our responsibilities to them?

The Torah assigns us dominion over the animal kingdom, a privilege that often is misinterpreted as giving greater significance to our survival and well-being than those with whom we share the planet.

In fact, Judaism has always accorded great concerns about the care and protection of animals. Both the Torah and the Talmud extol the importance of humane treatment of other species – particularly of those within our care.

The questions of whether one can work animals on Shabbat and holy days, the freedoms they must be given when not working, when they should be fed and with whom they may be worked and housed are all considered important topics in our literary treasury.

The prohibition forbidding the labor of work animals on Shabbat (Exodus 20:10) reminds us of the ethical implications involved as well as our own humane treatment of those in our care.

The positive mitzvah allowing one's animals to graze freely during the sabbatical year shows similar concern illustrating the place our tradition imposes on animal welfare.

No mitzvah better illustrates the Jew's relationship with animals than the rule of feeding them before feeding ourselves. Various laws extend from this interpretation of Deuteronomy 11:15, such as the mitzvah to feed one's animals when they are hungry and reflect the over arching prohibition against tza'ar ba'alei chayim, the suffering of living beings. We are prohibited from taking an active or passive part in an action that causes pain to another living creature. One authority even wrote that an owner who forgets to feed his pets but remembers after blessing his own food, must see to the task before eating.

In Judaism, the taking of the life of an animal must have a purpose that goes beyond any enjoyment; hence, hunting for sport is not generally regarded as a Jewish pastime. When hunting for food as a necessity, the Torah gives specific directions about humane practices.

Although the procedure is not without its critics, kosher slaughtering is intended to ensure that an animal does not suffer.

In more recent times, many modern sages have pointed out how pets serve a valuable and beneficial role providing comfort, companionship, and search, rescue, and recovery missions and are a valuable reminder of the special bond that links us to other members of the animal kingdom.

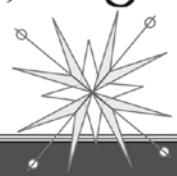

OST INTERFAITH PROGRAMMING WINS BELIN OUTREACH AWARD

Our programming for Interfaith families won the URJ's prestigious Belin Outreach Award Honorable Mention, which according to the grant letter, is "given to recognize exceptional programs from around North America that demonstrate a significant level of creativity, originality and replicability."

With assistance from various congregants and a newly revived Outreach Committee, we developed "The Year of Outreach" aimed at engaging our young Interfaith couples by offering a series of programs - cultural, spiritual, educational and social. The goal of this program was to bring together Temple members in interfaith marriages and relationships to create a community and to get them involved in Jewish education.

"For the past 18 years, the Belin Awards have encouraged Reform congregations to find innovative ways to welcome and engage those who might find a home in our congregations, bringing new life to our communities," said URJ Senior Vice President Rabbi Jonah Pesner. "The winners and honorable mentions exemplify the Jewish *mitzvot* of *ahavat ger*, loving the stranger and *keruv*, drawing near those who are far."

The final program in this series, "Celebrate Shabbat" will be held on June 27 at 6:00 pm. Led by Rabbi Roz, it involves a mock Shabbat dinner on a Thursday night, which will introduce the participants to the various rituals of a Friday night. All participants will leave with a *Celebrate Shabbat* toolkit, which outlines the prayers and rituals in English, Hebrew and transliteration.

This "Year of Outreach" program also won a Congregational Interfaith Mini-Grant from The Men of Reform Judaism.

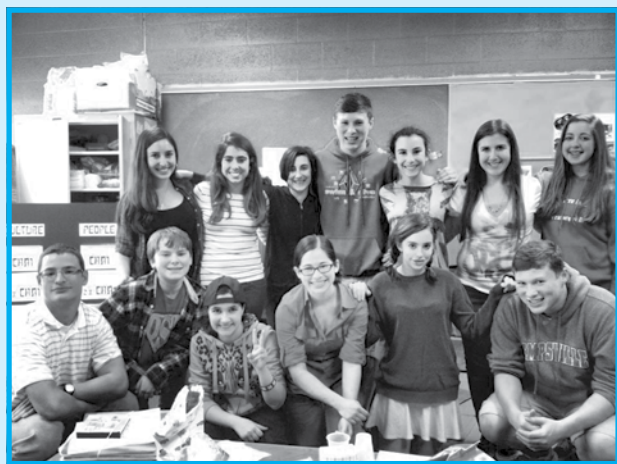

MITZVAH DAY 2013 "MITZVAH IN MOTION"

From packaging soup kits to making hospital bears, "Mitzvah in Motion" had the congregation at Ohef Sholom abuzz with outreach activities throughout the morning of Sunday, April 21. Two hundred and fifteen Sunday School students, from pre-K through confirmation, along with adult members and friends joined together to raise awareness and funds for the needs in the greater community.

At the beginning of the year, each religious school class selected a charity to receive the students' weekly *tzedakah*. Mitzvah Day gave them an opportunity to tell others about their chosen recipient and to raise more money for the cause. The beneficiaries include OST's Religious School Relief Fund; JFS Book Fund, Food Closet and Summer Camps; Make-A-Wish Foundation; Jewish Braille Institute; Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure Foundation; Hope for Life Animal Shelter; Juvenile Diabetes Research Fund, and Children's Hospital of the King's Daughters.

To kick off Ohef's 7th annual Mitzvah Day, Rabbi Roz held a brief service in the chapel. Class representatives, each adorned with a color-coded bandanna to identify their "team," described their cause and its importance. Then, the colorful crowd took off on a 1-mile sponsored walk around the Hague before returning to Ohef to participate in a slew of activities.

The Men's Club held its annual blood drive for the Red Cross in Simon Hall, the library was the site of the Foodbank Backpack program – a year-round program to supply food to hungry schoolchildren in Norfolk; the kitchen was put to use for making *Forkids* casseroles and doggie treats; the chapel for Braille education, and Kaufman Hall held a dozen stations with opportunities for hands-on participation.

The CHKD Bear Project, which supplies hand-made bears to hospitalized children, set up an impromptu sweat shop with an assembly line with some cutting patterns, others stuffing, and two valiant sewing machine operators putting together almost 100 bears.

Another assembly line had fifth-graders making 50 soup kits for residents of Virginia Supportive Housing's Gosnold Apartments, an independent living project that Ohef congregants support year round with food and household supplies. Once again Sharon Ross provided the accompanying recipe. Another year-round project, "Hot Meals and Homework" *Forkids* supported by the Sisterhood, received 19 casseroles from the morning's endeavors led by Jeanne Miller, Sharon Nusbaum and Sandi Levi. Meanwhile, 16 second-graders stepped up to fill bags with paper goods and toiletries for the JFS Food Closet.

The Jewish Braille Institute drew strong interest from its fourth-grade benefactors as Debbie Prost made Braille name cards for each of them and congregant Rabbi Connie Golden spoke with them about its work.

Children of all ages enjoyed adding sprinkles to cookies, shaping doggie treat dough; and making posters and decorating race boxes for the Susan G. Komen Race for the Cure. Visitors to the Hope for Life Animal Shelter booth met its canine friend (later adopted) and learned about its care for animals. The Make-A-Wish and Juvenile Diabetes groups also had educational displays about their work.

Once again, the participation of so many – OST staff and clergy, Sunday School teachers, parents, room parents, students, families, congregants and friends – made for another outstanding day of caring and outreach in the spirit of *tikkun olam*.

Thanks go to Inger Friedman, Caring Committee chair, Sharon Ross, Dorianne Villani, Debi Stadlin, Anne Kramer, Barbara Johnson, Sandi Forte-Nickenig, Karen Fine and members of the Sisterhood and Men's Club for their outstanding support and organization --- and to all the others who participated in illustrating what a vibrant, caring community Ohef Sholom is each and every day.

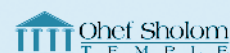


Have you ever felt lost in a Jewish Shabbat service?
