

A Word from Rabbi Steinberg

What Is Reform Judaism?

Throughout history, we Jews have remained firmly rooted in Jewish tradition, even as we learned much from our encounters with other cultures. Nevertheless, since its earliest days in Germany, from the beginning to the mid 1800s, Reform Judaism has asserted that a Judaism frozen in time is an heirloom, not a living fountain.

The greatest contribution of Reform Judaism is that it has enabled the Jewish people to:

- a) introduce innovation while preserving tradition,
- b) embrace diversity while asserting commonality,
- c) affirm beliefs without rejecting doubt, and
- d) bring faith to sacred texts without sacrificing critical scholarship.

Although we have come far in bringing Judaism into the 21st Century, detractors still suspect that Reform is "Judaism-Lite" and that we are moving away from "real" Judaism into a state of assimilation. Nothing could be further from reality. Throughout history Judaism has re-formed and adapted its modes of expression as a result of historic realities that impacted it. Perhaps one of the first major re-formings was a result of the destruction of Solomon's Temple in ancient Jerusalem when all of religious behavior shifted from Temple-centered worship to synagogue gatherings, from a sacrificial orientation to a prayer-dominated atmosphere. The very development of Rabbinic literature such as the Mishna, Gemara, Commentaries, and Responsa is an example of the re-formation of earlier Torah laws as societal conditions changed. These relocations of emphasis occurred repeatedly throughout our historic journey through the ages.

Reform is the largest and still the fastest growing expression of Judaism in the United States. It is estimated that hundreds of thousands of American Jewish families maintained their connections to Judaism because of this Movement which demonstrated that one could be Jewish and sophisticatedly modern in this confusing world.

Here's an example from the perspective of our children's religious education. Unlike traditionally-oriented parents, both Jewish and non-Jewish, we do not have to rationalize our beliefs in the face of modernity. We do not have to equivocate or even apologize to our children as they question the lessons we taught them in their earlier years. We never have to say, "Well actually, there is no Santa (or Job or Jonah or Elijah)." We never have to say, "The Torah tells us such and such, so it must be true despite empirical evidence to the contrary." We never have to say, "It is a mystery that will be revealed to us at a later time." What we teach our children is, age appropriately, honest, reasonable, and emotionally satisfying in their quest to find meaning in life. The primary task of Jewish education is to transform an ascribed identity into a chosen identity, essentially to turn Jews-by-chance into Jews-by-choice. We can do this only with intellectual honesty and with personal integrity.

Reform Judaism affirms the central tenets of Judaism -- God, Torah, and Israel -- even as it acknowledges the diversity of Reform Jewish beliefs and practices as a demonstration of its liberal acceptance of how its diverse membership may be accommodated. Reform Jews accept the ethical mandates of Torah as the foundation of Jewish life, as the record of our people's ongoing relationship with their understanding of the nature of God. We see the Torah as a God-inspired, human document that enables us to confront the timeless and timely challenges of our daily lives. We accept the critical theory of Biblical authorship: that the Bible was written by separate sources and redacted many times, each time reflecting the teachings and perceived needs of the era.

In addition to believing that Judaism must change and adapt to the needs of the day to survive with dignity and intellectual integrity, we Reform Jews firmly embrace our commitment to *Tikkun Olam*, repairing the world. We believe that we are God's partners in the ongoing and as yet incomplete creation of a just society. Further, Reform Judaism is committed to the principle of inclusion not exclusion. We actively, not grudgingly, reach out to Jews-by-choice and interfaith families. Reform Judaism considers children to be Jewish if they are the child of a Jewish father or mother, as long as the child is raised Jewishly. We are committed to the absolute equality of women and men in all areas of Jewish life. We are committed to full acceptance of, and totally equal participation in synagogue life to, all Jews whatever their sexual orientation.

Presently there are approximately one million Reform Jews in America as members of some 900 congregations.

Derek and Mallory Weinstein were checking people in, and Arnold Barr and I were greeting our guests. And of course our amazing Sharon Ross was orchestrating it all.

This was just one night of the 7 days and nights that Ohef Sholom Temple hosted NEST and there are many, many other heroes of NEST at OST who volunteered their time over the first week of January – a very, very wet and unusually cold week. I just want to say how proud and grateful I am to be a member of OST, and at the same time, I am thankful that if not for the grace of God, I could be a guest of NEST.

I hope you will join me and the many other volunteers at NEST next year, as well as at our Soup Kitchen the last Monday of every month, at JCOC, at Oasis in Portsmouth on the second Sunday morning of the month, and at the many meetings and projects of the Caring Committee, chaired by Ingeresa Friedman and Dorianne Villani, throughout the year.

Our OST Caring Committee gives new meaning to the words *Tikkun Olam* (repairing the world). Also, please consider volunteering to help on Mitzvah Day which will take place on April 6, 2014.

That makes 50 teens who give up their Sunday mornings to help provide younger children with a great Jewish and Hebrew Education! This is more than any other temple in the area, in the state even! We owe them a BIG *TODAH RABBAH!* (Hebrew for THANK YOU VERY MUCH!) If you see one of our *Madrichim* or Hebrew Helpers, be sure to tell them how much they are appreciated.




