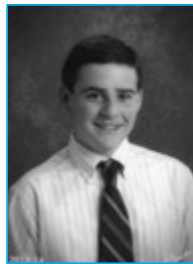

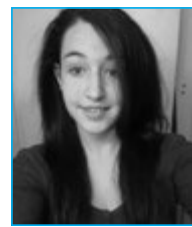

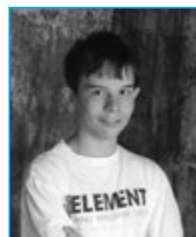

This month we observe two important military holidays: **Armed Forces Day and Memorial Day.**

ARMED FORCES DAY – MAY 17

On August 31, 1949, Secretary of Defense Louis Johnson announced the creation of an Armed Forces Day to replace separate Army, Navy and Air Force Days. The single-day celebration stemmed from the unification of the Armed Forces under one department -- the Department of Defense.

The theme of the first Armed Forces Day was "Teamed for Defense." It was chosen as a means of expressing the unification of all the military forces under a single department of the government. Although this was the theme for the day, there were several other purposes for holding Armed Forces Day. It was a type of "educational program for civilians," one in which there would be an increased awareness of the Armed Forces. It was designed to expand public understanding of what type of job is performed and the role of the military in civilian life. It was a day to honor and acknowledge the people of the Armed Forces of the United States.

The MSOC invites you to join us for OST's Armed Forces Shabbat Service on Friday, May 16, at 6:30 p.m. to honor the men and women formerly or currently serving our country.

MEMORIAL DAY – MAY 26

Three years after the Civil War ended, on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of Union veterans – the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) – established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the war dead with flowers. Maj. Gen. John A. Logan declared that Decoration Day should be observed on May 30. It is believed that date was chosen because flowers would be in bloom all over the country.

In 1968 Congress passed the Uniform Monday Holiday Act, which established Memorial Day as the last Monday in May in order to create a three-day weekend for Federal employees; the change went into effect in 1971. The same law also declared Memorial Day a Federal holiday.

Many Americans observe Memorial Day by visiting cemeteries or memorials, holding family gatherings and participating in parades. Unofficially, at least, it marks the beginning of summer.

This Memorial Day honor a loved one's sacrifice to our country by making a donation to the MSOC online or mailing a check to the Temple office. Please mention Memorial Day on the memo line.

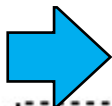

I am involved with the Temple because Ohef Sholom is my home away from home, and it's the only place I feel totally and completely in my element.
