OST Attends PrideFest 2014



As our mission statement reads, Ohef Sholom Temple is "...a House of Prayer for all peoples." With that in mind, congregants and clergy from OST attended PrideFest2014 at Town Point Park in Norfolk on August 23. The Temple set up an interactive booth, which was well received, and shared a tent with two churches and an interfaith coalition. "Many people came up and just thanked us for being there," said Linda Fox-Jarvis, President.

Cantor Wally participated with clergy from a variety of faith groups in a ceremony offering blessings for couples and individuals. It was a unified message of support for members of the community. The group then made a procession across the entire park and was called up on

the main stage to reinforce the message that "We are here and we are welcoming!"

"It was interesting," said Fox-Jarvis. "We had a lot of people who came up and said one of their parents was Jewish, or they went to synagogue when they were young, or that they were just searching for a religious home that would accept the LGBT community. Many were just interested in Jewish philosophy and the Jewish position regarding LGBT."

"One of the statistics in last year's Pew Study was that 49% of persons who consider themselves Jewish are unmarried. Many in the LGBT community are part of that 49%, and we wanted to reach out to them," Fox-Jarvis said.

A Word from Rabbi Steinberg

During this month of *Tishri*, we shall be celebrating the Festival of *Sukkot* and the joyous holiday of *Simchat Torah*, both of which remind us of our origins as members of a special peoplehood.

Exactly three hundred and sixty years ago last week, an event occurred that secured our presence in this remarkable land where we have made an unprecedented settlement and grown our peoplehood to historic proportions.

Below is an exchange of letters between the Director General of New Amsterdam and the Directors of the Dutch East India Company. Stuyvesant pleaded for non-toleration of fourteen newly arrived Jews from Recife, Brazil. His Directors wisely demurred (please note the bold sentence in their response).

Historians point to this exchange as setting the groundwork for the Jewish presence in America.

To The Board Of Directors of The Dutch East India Company, September 22, 1654

Jews have arrived and would nearly all like to remain here, but learning that they (with their customary usury and deceitful trading with the Christians) were very repugnant to the inferior magistrates, as also to the people having the most affection for you; the Deaconry (taking care of the poor) also fearing that owing to their present indigence (captured and robbed by pirates) they might become a charge in the coming winter, we have, for the benefit of the weak and newly developing place and the land in general, deemed it useful to require them in a friendly way to depart; praying also most seriously in this connection, for ourselves as also for the general community of your worships that this deceitful race, hateful enemies and blasphemers of the name of Christ, be not allowed further to infect and trouble this new colony, to the detraction of your worships and the dissatisfaction of your worships' most affectionate subjects.

Peter Stuyvesant, Director General, New Netherland

To The Director General, New Netherland April 26, 1655

Honorable, Prudent, Pious, Dear Faithful ... We would like to effectuate and fulfill your wishes and request that the new territories should no more be allowed to be infected by people of the Jewish nation, for we foresee therefrom the same difficulties which you fear. But after having weighed and considered the matter, we observe that this would be somewhat unreasonable and unfair, especially because of the considerable loss sustained by this nation in the taking of Brazil **and also because of the large amount of capital which they have invested in the shares of this company.** Therefore after many deliberations we have finally decided and resolved that these people may travel and trade to and in New Netherland and live and remain there, provided the poor among them not become a burden to the company or the community but be supported by their own nation. You will now govern yourself accordingly.

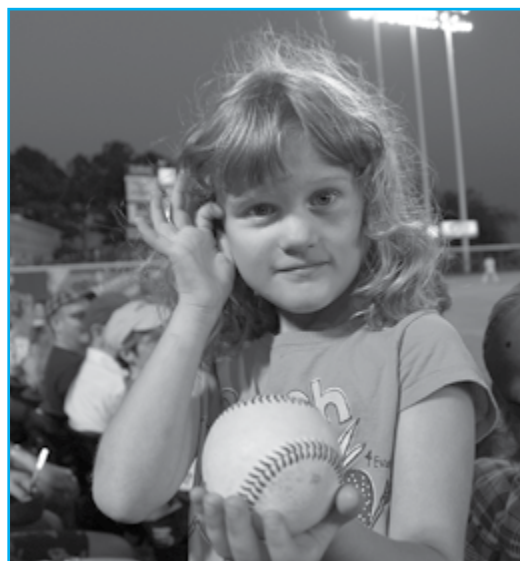

Caring Committee: Reaching Out/In to Those in Need

The Caring Committee is proud to host several ongoing programs to reach out to those in need in our local community: we run a monthly Soup Kitchen; prepare and serve meals at the Judeo-Christian Outreach Center (JCOC); host the homeless for a week with Norfolk Emergency Shelter Team (NEST); pack non-perishable food for needy students, and take part in a myriad of other community outreach activities.

As part of our Temple in-reach to congregants, last year the Caring Committee created a new branch called *Chaver l'Chaver/Member to Member*. Volunteers call or visit fellow Temple members to provide compassion, companionship, and community in times of illness, bereavement, or other life struggles in order to help facilitate healing and wholeness. Several volunteers already have made visits to fellow congregants while their spouses were in the hospital, or taken new friends grocery shopping when they could not drive themselves. Others have assisted with shiva visits, providing a shoulder for the bereaved and assistance during the meal. If one of your family members or friends would welcome a caring phone call or could be helped in any way by their Temple family, be it through meals, rides, or a friendly visit, please contact our Temple office, and we will reach out to you in friendship and kindness. Confidentiality is always respected.

As Sukkot nears, we will be partnering with several Jewish agencies to conduct a community food drive through Thanksgiving, to provide holiday meal baskets for families served by Jewish Family Services, and for families of the students we sponsor at Chesterfield Academy Elementary School. Our goal is 50 baskets filled with all the trimmings for a Holiday Meal, accompanied by a turkey and fresh produce.

Please think of those less fortunate, as you do your holiday meal shopping – buy one for yourself, and buy one for someone else, and bring your bounty into the collection site at the Temple by **Sunday, November 16**. Our Religious School will be conducting classroom food collections, as well as creating gift cards to be delivered with each meal basket, and helping sort and pack the food.

The shopping list will be distributed at the Temple, at Religious School, on the OST website and on *As The Temple Turns*.

Why a Kallah and not a Shabbaton?

A Shabbaton is a study session on the Sabbath; a Kallah is a study session that can start any day of the week. Whether held on the Sabbath or starting with Havdalah on Saturday night, our Sisterhood getaways have been a honeymoon of study (Kallah also means “Bride”).

The 2014 Kallah Committee Members were asked about their fondest reflections of previous sessions they attended. Some comments were: loved hearing personal stories and getting to know each other better; learning more about Judaism; feeling of sisterhood and of all ages coming together; sense of purpose; spirituality; seeing the God (holiness) in others; since then, I felt Shabbat in a new way, increased feelings of being Jewish; getting closer to one another.

One comment particularly resonates with this year’s theme....

“The Kallah breaks down the age barrier.”

The Torah portion during the Kallah this year is “The Life of Sarah.”

One Midrash claims: “The seven-year-old has innocence; the 20-year-old has strength; the 100-year-old has wisdom. The secret of the greatness of Sarah was that throughout her entire life, she was 100 and 20 and 7.”

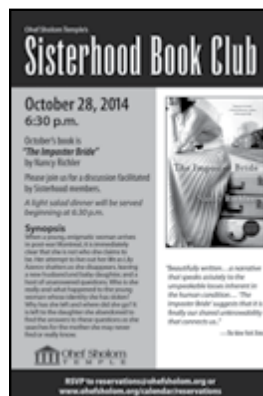
