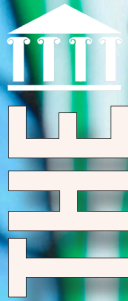

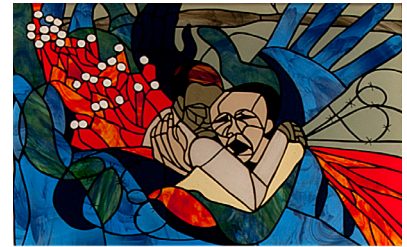

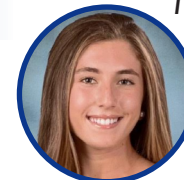

Tending the Garden: Our Sacred Trust

For the ground upon which you stand is holy. (Exodus 3:5)

Did you know?

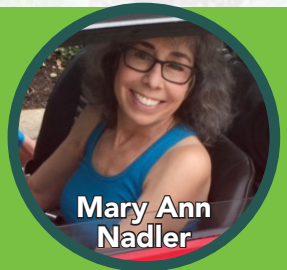
One of every three bites we eat depends on insects or other animals.

Livestock graze on crops that require pollinators.

Bees and other pollinators are responsible for nutritional crops.

3,500+ bee species are on the endangered list for the first time.

The Nadler Garden was started by and named in honor of Mary Ann Nadler. Her commitment to a belief that we as Jews are expected to care for sacred ground led her to take on our temple garden and care for it in a way that helps heal the world. Her work on our garden led to several awards.

Scientists estimate that one-third of plants and animal species are at risk for extinction. Climate change, habitat loss, and pesticide and herbicide use are drivers in this major decline. This is what inspired the start of the Nadler Native Plant Garden at Ohef Sholom Temple.

Many hybrid plants provide little or no food for native wildlife. Native plants are dispersed with no human involvement and form relationships with animals.

To design traditional gardens with native plants, we need to think outside the "boxwood!" For example, instead of European boxwoods (*Buxus sempervirens*), consider a native inkberry or gallberry (*Ilex glabra*). It provides cover and fruit for birds.

Yards are ecological dead zones, water and fertilizer intensive. For a grassy look in shady areas, consider a native plant such as Pennsylvania sedge (*Carex pensylvanica*). This species can host over thirty species of caterpillars. Without caterpillars, baby birds starve to death.

Although we may have to adjust our idea of what a perfect garden looks like, designing attractive gardens with native plants is possible. We will have to accept plant damage as caterpillars eat milkweed leaves, but by doing so we support biodiversity and the garden sustainably. More significantly, our yards can help reverse environmental trends that impact wildlife and our food supply. Every native plant will contribute. Together, our yards can be part of the solution, not part of the problem. For the ground upon which we all stand is holy ground.

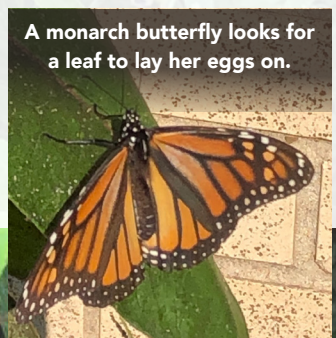

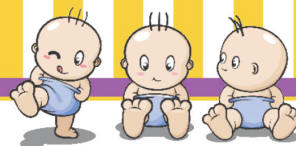

The Mollie and George Radin Archive of Ohef Sholom Temple was created to collect and preserve records of enduring value that document the rich history and traditions of this historic congregation and the Jewish community of Tidewater Virginia. Holdings include the records and artifacts of the Temple and congregation, as well as a wide range of manuscript materials; artifacts; and audio and visual materials, including photographs and oral history recordings. The Archives surveys, inventories, and processes these records and makes them available to members of the congregation, educators, and authorized researchers. Through its historical records and collections, the Archives strives to keep faith with those who have gone before and to inform current generations and generations to come. The OST Library is divided into an Adult section of nearly 6,000 volumes, and a student section primarily used by our Religious School. It is highly regarded by Judaic researchers from many locations east of the Mississippi River, having hosted a dozen researchers or more in the past 20 years. We heard once that our collection was the largest Judaic book collection east of Richmond in our Commonwealth of Virginia. It is free to use for our Temple members, and searchable on our website.

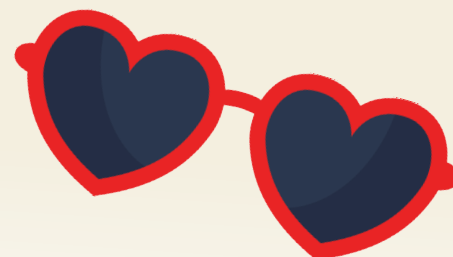
