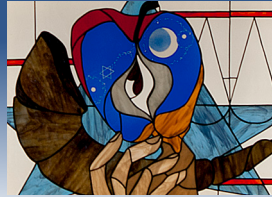

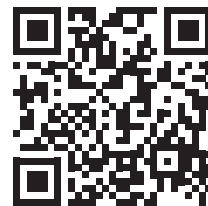

We look forward to delivering fleece blankets to CHKD in the Fall. Stay tuned for more information!

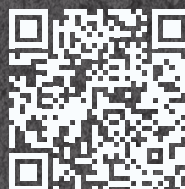

INVASIVE PLANTS

There are plants that we love to see coming up in our gardens and in the woods every year. Then there are the plants that we hate, the invasive plants that sometimes seems like they're everywhere. The USDA defines an invasive species as a species that is "Non-native (or alien) to the ecosystem under consideration; and, whose introduction causes or is likely to cause economic or environmental harm or harm to human health." Many of these plants were brought to the U.S. accidentally such as Japanese Stilt grass, which was used to pack porcelains for shipping. Others were bought in deliberately such as kudzu, in the mistaken belief that it would make good animal fodder. It didn't. One of the most common invasives, which is still sold and used in landscaping is English Ivy. The problem with English Ivy is that it has escaped cultivation to take over gardens and forests. It can choke out native plants on the ground. Ivy can also grow so thick on trees that it blocks sunlight, covers up any potential diseases or insect infestations, and can add so much weight that the tree can fall in a storm. Another invasive, which can be deceptively attractive is the Bradford or Callery pear. These trees which were just recently in bloom, full of white flowers, were introduced from Asia in the 1960's and were once called the perfect urban tree. However they are now notorious for smelling bad, and having thorns and weak structure. Also despite, assurances to the contrary they do spread and force out native trees. There are many, many more invasives to be on the lookout for. A complete list can be found using this QR code. The important thing is don't buy these plants and when you find them in your yard, remove them.

The Henry B. Kaufmann Award is bestowed by the Ohef Sholom Temple Men's Club upon an adult congregant who has demonstrated extraordinary service to the Temple and the community in a volunteer capacity. The award's namesake, Henry B. Kaufmann, was an accountant by trade and extremely active in synagogue and community life. On this, the 40th anniversary of the first presentation, we honor Matthew Weinstein as recipient.

Born and raised in New Jersey, Matthew attended the University of Virginia. Upon graduation he embarked upon the path that would ultimately lead to a highly successful career in hospital administration and corporate management. Thirty five years ago, Matthew, and his lovely wife Giselle, decided to settle in Virginia Beach. Very family oriented, the couple have three adult children and six grandchildren who they visit often.

Matthew is a prolific volunteer. The list of organizations for which he has served could fill a book. A sampling of his Temple activities include: past Co-Chair of the Adult Education Committee, past Men's Club President (three times!), past member of the



Board of Directors, past Temple Vice President, and past Director of the Ohef Sholom Temple Foundation. Numerous other committees on which he has served include: Long Range Planning, Personnel, Finance and Accounting, and a number of ad hocs. He helped organize several Mussar (Jewish spirituality) groups and continues to act as a Mussar facilitator.

On the community side, one of Matthew's proudest achievements, and an opportunity to put his vast knowledge of hospital administration to work, is his involvement with Beth Sholom Village as a past Secretary and President. He is also the Founder/Board Chairman/Project Coordinator of Faith Works Coalition. Faith Works is an all-volunteer organization made up of religious outreach groups, businesses and individuals from all walks of life. Their mission statement is, "To eliminate poor living conditions by providing health and safety repairs for the elderly, disabled and low income homeowners in Chesapeake and Virginia Beach." Following his passion for music---he plays saxophone and piano---Matthew is Secretary, Vice President and Board member of the Tidewater Winds. Of note, one of his original compositions was performed by The Winds at various venues in years past.

Matthew and Giselle are fervently dedicated to assisting legal asylum seekers, who have recently settled in the area, by providing them food, shelter, vocational support, language training and health care. Additionally, for two years they sheltered a young mother and her two children, who had been in an abusive situation, until she was able to get on her feet financially, vocationally and emotionally.

When he is not volunteering, or fixing something around the house, you can usually find Matthew cooking for large family gatherings, playing piano or sax, working out, or on a tennis court or golf course where he claims to be a "club tennis player and very bad golfer." This successful, compassionate, Renaissance man, with the quick wit and self-deprecating sense of humor, is a true mensch in every sense of the word.

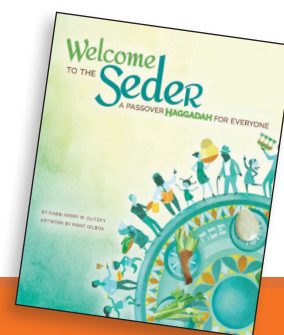
