ROSENBACH AWARD

Mazel Tov to Dorianne Villani, the 2023 recipient of the prestigious Kurt Rosenbach Award!

The award was established in 2004 and is given to an OST Board member whose outstanding service to OST best embodies the qualities and commitment demonstrated by our beloved Kurt Rosenbach, of blessed memory. Kurt served actively on the OST Board well into his 90s. Dorianne received this well-deserved honor at the Annual Meeting on May 18.

Years ago, Dorianne was profoundly inspired by a midrash discussion led by Rabbi Arthur Steinberg, of blessed memory. Rabbi offered that there are windows in a sanctuary so that worshipers are obligated to see the world's imperfections and to do something about them. In response, Dorianne opened her heart to those most vulnerable in our community by founding and organizing our monthly soup kitchen 13 years ago. The guests receive not only hearty meals, but also clothing, toiletries and haircuts. Her tireless efforts led to OST's JCOC outreach effort, the recruitment of 20 churches to

participate in the Ghent Homelessness Task Force, Chesterfield Elementary School's "Backpacks for Weekends" program for children of low-income households, meals and desks for ForKids, and the Love Thy Neighbor Committee to support first responders and community agencies during COVID. More recently, she initiated and continues to co-chair the Mitzvah Meals project serving 100 meals to a local homeless shelter. As a Board member, Dorianne chaired the Caring Committee for six years, co-chaired the Membership and Military Outreach Committees, and ran the Temple's Mitzvah Day for three years. Rabbi Roz expressed gratitude to Dorianne, noting in her remarks that "It takes a special person to see the innate worth and goodness of every person, especially if they look different from us, or have a different station in life. Tonight we honor someone who does just that, who for decades has opened her heart and given tirelessly of herself to the neediest members of our community!"

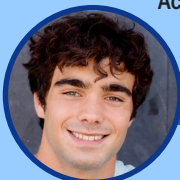

Feed your soul the following week. On Fridays, August 18th and 25th, we will welcome guest speakers for services that will center around Teshuvah. This is the Jewish principle of seeking atonement and repentance before Yom Kippur, encouraging reflection and introspection. As always join us for a wonderful congregational Oneg after services.

Finally, on Friday, August 25th, the temple will host the Shabbat B'Yachad Welcome Back Service & Dinner, inviting members of the community back together and sharing a meal as they continue their spiritual journeys.

Through these various events, there is a unique opportunity for congregants to engage with their faith, community members, and enjoy good food. The events will not only feed the body but also feed the craving for closeness and connection within the community, nourishing the souls and building meaningful relationships.

Everything Bagel Dip:



Ingredients:

- 8 oz. cream cheese, softened
- 1/2 cup sour cream
- 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1/4 teaspoon garlic powder
- 1/4 teaspoon onion powder
- 1/4 teaspoon paprika
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 2 tablespoons everything bagel seasoning
- Bagel chips or vegetables

Instructions:

1. In a medium mixing bowl, combine the softened cream cheese, sour cream, and lemon juice. Use a hand mixer or a whisk to blend until smooth.
2. Add the garlic powder, onion powder, paprika, and salt to the cream cheese mixture. Blend until all the spices have been fully incorporated.
3. Fold in 1 tablespoon of the everything bagel seasoning using a spatula.
4. Taste the dip and add more seasoning or salt if needed.
5. Transfer the dip to a serving bowl or platter and sprinkle the remaining everything bagel seasoning on top of the dip before serving.

A Message About Engagement by President Sharon Nusbaum

The inscription on our building, "My house shall be called a house of prayer for all peoples," has been a source of inspiration and pride for our congregation from the time it was etched in the stone above the portico of Ohel Sholom Temple in 1917. We strive to be a welcoming community to all. I have been thinking about what welcoming means. How do members of our community and those yet to join us find a comfortable, rewarding and spiritually meaningful place in our sacred space, a place where they feel they belong?

This past January, Beco Lichtman spent a weekend here as a scholar-in-residence. In addition to discussions about bridging the racial and religious divides in our greater community and dealing with antisemitism, there were discussions about how we can be more welcoming beyond just greeting our newer members, guests and each other. How do we truly engage? I recall the enthusiasm among those who attended, eager to find ways to make it happen. Here are some ways for deepening engagement and inclusion mentioned that weekend or have been tried by other congregations:

- Provide more training for greeters and ushers.
- Launch an inclusion committee.
- Organize affinity groups to talk honestly about our own

conscious or unconscious biases and find support among fellow members who have similarly experienced the pain of exclusion or bias, or other challenging experiences.

- Start a social justice committee to address issues of racial and gender equity and inclusion in the larger community.

How do we get started? The Union for Reform Judaism has wonderful resources to assist us to accomplish such activities, and we have the benefit of the expertise of our clergy and other experienced leaders in our congregation. Over the past year, the volunteers of our Engagement Committee, chaired by Carol Brum, planned and executed some very creative and well-attended family outings. Our clergy, staff and volunteers led multigenerational worship services and Shabbat dinners. Mazel Tov to the congregants and clergy who led our first ever Pride service on June 23! These activities are examples of engagement and inclusion.

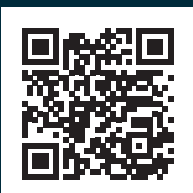
