Elul's Gift



Jewish tradition teaches that we ought to live each of our lives the fullest, since we never know when our time to depart this earth may come.

While life's fragility and sometimes seeming randomness is not lost on any of us, we often forget to make each day truly count.

We take those things that are most important - our health, our relationships, our personal goals, our spiritual fulfillment and our commitment to repair the world - for granted.

"Tomorrow is another day," we think, as we push off that which should top our to-do lists in pursuit of things that really don't matter in the ultimate tally of our lives.

Recognizing this very human behavior, Judaism dedicates the month of Elul, which began August 18th, to evaluate ourselves in preparation for the High Holidays, now just two weeks away. With the daily morning sounding of the shofar, we are awakened to examine our lives and to take an accounting of our own souls - a cheshbon nefesh.

We ask questions:

How have I behaved over the last year? Was I attentive to my loved ones? Did I spend quality time with them?

Was I kind and respectful in my interactions with all people? Did I take good care of myself? Did I treat myself well, giving myself time for rest, reflection, pleasure, and fun? Did I live up to my potential and do my best in my endeavors?

Did I take time to study, to volunteer? Did I give tzedakah?

The month of Elul is a gift, an opportunity to affirm the good in us while striving for personal, interpersonal and spiritual improvements in our relationships with ourselves, others, and God. By taking seriously the real need to engage in this process of teshuvah - change, repentance, and renewal - we allow Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur to become true times of introspection and growth, worthy of God's mercy and love, our own inner peace and the redemption of the world.

Yom Kippur is the day we come face to face with our mortality; "who shall live and who shall die?" Our liturgy reminds us that each day may truly be our last, and therefore, we are to make certain that our "houses" are in order. Have we done right by those we love? Have we fulfilled our tasks responsibly and wholeheartedly? Are we at peace with ourselves?

Yes, these are very difficult questions to answer and even more challenging to achieve. Yet in our realization of them, we will find ourselves living our lives precisely as Judaism demands of us each and every day.

We will be living our lives to the fullest.

May we each use this month of Elul to engage in the work we all must do so that the High Holidays find us strengthened, encouraged and renewed, and so that the New Year brings us health, fulfillment, love, and peace.

PRESIDENTIAL ADDRESS

Choosing Gratitude

I love the poem by Judith Z. Abrams, found in our Siddur, Mishkan T'filah, and often read by our Clergy during services:

"God of Goodness, we give thanks
For the gift of life, wonder beyond words;
For the awareness of soul, our light within;
For the world around us, so filled with beauty;
For the richness of the earth, which day by day sustains us;
For all these things and more, we offer thanks."

It reminds me of the importance of gratitude for the many ways we are blessed. It also reminds me that gratitude takes practice, or to use a phrase often expressed, it involves "cultivating an attitude of gratitude." The month of Elul, culminating in Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, is traditionally a time to prepare our hearts and our thoughts for the High Holy Days--for t'shuvah, repentance, return and renewal. My personal commitment this year is to be more mindful of what is in front of me, in the moment, for which to appreciate and give thanks, whether it is the beauty around me, the kindness of others or the persons I meet, taking that moment to appreciate who they are and really listen to what they have to say. To assist me in the process, I am using a notebook to make a daily list of items for which I am grateful, as well as notes expressing areas where I might improve. To remind me of my intention, I also purchased a couple of signs on Amazon which say, "Choose Gratitude," to display in my home.

In THIS moment, I am thankful to Rabbi Roz Mandelberg and Cantor Jen Rueben for leading us in inspiring and thoughtful worship during Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, and to the clergy and Chuck Woodward for their work to create meaningful worship. Thank you to our Executive Director, Jennifer Levin-Tavares, for joining our Temple team and very ably shepherding OST's office

administration and staff. 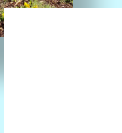

Animals Have Their Own New Year

On August 18, Jews celebrated the New Year. No, it wasn't Rosh Hashanah or Tu B'Shevat, the New Year of Trees or even the New Year of Kings (which takes place at Passover). This New Year was Rosh Hashanah La'behmot, The New Year of Animals.

Traditionally this was a Temple-based ritual which involved selecting which domestic animals were to be tithed. The holiday eventually faded into obscurity, but in 2009 a ritual was held at the goat barn on the campus of the Isabelle Freedman Jewish Retreat Center in Connecticut which included a blessing of assembled farm and pet animals. Since that time observance of the holiday has grown and has taken on broader implications. People are encouraged to examine their relationship with the domestic animals that we depend on and to consider wild animals whose habitats we have disrupted.

There are important Biblical precepts in Judaism that tell us how to treat animals, especially tza'ar ba'alei hayim, the prohibition of unnecessary cruelty in our treatment of animals.

There are many ways to observe Rosh Hashanah La'behmot. Suggestions include volunteering at an animal shelter, cutting food waste, making better food choices, demonstrating good animal welfare practices, and adding landscaping that supports wildlife.

There is much that we can learn and contribute by celebrating this holiday. Job 12:7 says, "But ask the animals and they shall teach you: the birds of the air and they will tell you."

Shana Tovah and welcome to another exciting year of learning at Ohef Sholom Temple Religious School. We are looking forward to seeing the familiar faces returning, and thrilled to meet all of the new Religious School families that are joining us for the first time this year. The teachers and staff have been working hard preparing for what is sure to be a fantastic year!

Every summer allows us an opportunity to look back and reflect on the school year that just ended, and this summer was no exception. As I look back I think about all the joyous occasions we all shared together. Whether that was in the classroom learning, our madrichim (teen assistants) working one-on-one with our Hebrew students, cooking, creating art projects, families coming together for our holiday programming, or singing and praying together during tefilah, we shared some great moments as a community and I am thrilled to witness it all again this year.

Our school year begins on September 10, right before the High Holidays. We have a full day planned. Starting at 8:45 we invite all our Hebrew students to join us in Kaufman Hall. Then at 9:30 (NEW THIS YEAR) our Religious School day begins. Once you arrive the entire family will join us in the sanctuary for a welcome gathering. After the students head to their respective classes with their teachers, families are invited to stay and join us in Simon Hall for food, drinks, and schmoozing. Our various temple committees will be available to meet you and answer any questions you may have. We will conclude our day as a whole school where everyone will participate in a special t'filah, and then we will head outdoors for our reverse tashlich event.

As we continue on with our year you may notice some enhancements that have been made, which we are all very excited for. They include:

- New Hebrew School time of 8:45 am-9:30 am, with a weekday 20 minute one-on-one Zoom option.
- New Religious School START TIME of 9:30 am, still dismissing at NOON.
- New curriculum from the Institute of Southern Jewish Living for grades PreK-6th.
- Moving the start of Hebrew School to 4th grade and using a new one-on-one curriculum for decoding (Let's Learn Hebrew Side-by-Side)
- 5 Family B'Nai Mitzvah sessions for our 6th grade families held during Religious School (dates will be shared to those families separately) using the Moving Traditions curriculum
- Electives based curriculum for our 7th-9th graders.
- New dismissal procedures.

As you can see we have a lot in store for our students and families this year and we are so excited for you to be a part of it.

Feeding the Hungry: Friends of Giselle

A Powerful Interfaith Mitzvah Project

Feeding the hungry is among the mitzvot in Torah so valuable that its reward cannot be measured. In this spirit, members of OST have the opportunity to partake in a very large interfaith mitzvah project named Friends of Giselle after OST member Giselle Weinstein.

The project involves providing weekly groceries to 14 immigrant families who live in Hampton Roads (77 people in total, most of whom are children). OST provides food the second week of each month. Church of the Holy Family and other community partners take care of the remaining weeks. The project is organized by our Immigration Task Force members. We have committed to staying with the project for one year.

Here is how you can help.

Donate

The cost of groceries is \$25 per person, per month. We ask that those who choose to participate in funding commit to \$300 per person (12 months @ \$25/month per person). The cost can be added to your monthly membership bill, or you can write a separate check to OST (donations are tax deductible). You can choose to help as many people as you wish.

Volunteer to Package

We need help dividing and repackaging bulk items and preparing them for delivery to the families.

Volunteer to Shop

We need shoppers every month during the second week of the month.

Volunteer to Deliver

Each month on the second Thursday, we need help delivering groceries to families' homes. If you have a big car, great! If you speak Spanish, we could especially use your help.

Can you imagine how it feels to be handed a toothbrush and toothpaste when you haven't been able to brush your teeth in a week or longer? Or how it feels to be kindly offered the only meal you will get to eat that day? You don't have to imagine how that feels - you can come experience it for yourself and see the smiles of gratitude at either (or both!) of our OST programs where we come together to feed our homeless and hungry neighbors. On the last Monday of every month, from 9 am to 1pm, we host a lunch Soup Kitchen at OST. Our Soup Kitchen has evolved over the years into much more than just the feeding of hungry people. It takes many hands to operate the Clothes Closet, toiletries distribution, food pantry, and of course lovingly prepare and serve a hot, nutritious meal, all while offering friendship and fellowship to our guests who don't often have the opportunity to receive that. In addition, every few months, we host a program we call Mitzvah Meals, where we provide dinner to the 100 residents at the new Homeless Shelter on Tidewater Drive because they do not have access to a kitchen, so we prepare the meal at OST, individually box the 100 meals, and transport them to the Shelter and personally distribute them with toiletries and new Bombas socks.

We would love to warmly welcome you to serve these deserving guests and to work side-by-side with us to bring dignity and kindness to those who sorely need it.

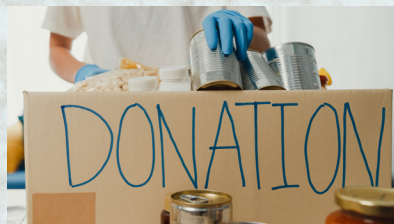
