I am happy to highlight some wonderful events that took place during January and February!

Rabbi Roz and Cantor Jen led a beautiful, multigenerational Tu B'Shvat Seder on January 25. This was the first time a congregation-wide seder of this kind was done in at least two decades. Food pairings, representing the seven species of Israel, and a delicious potluck dinner were enjoyed by all. Thank you to Ellen Hundley for a wonderful job organizing the food. She and other volunteers prepared all of the items for the Seder observance. Thanks also to the staff for their support throughout the preparation and the event itself.

One hundred people of all generations attended a lively Shabbat Family Experience on Saturday, January 27. The enthusiasm of the clergy was contagious, and everyone had a great time! Thank you to Marcy and Paul Terkeltaub for sponsoring a lovely kiddush lunch after the service! This popular event will return to Sinai Chapel on Saturday, May 18.

Rabbi Roz and Cantor Jen led a four-part Zoom discussion series based on the book, Israel: A Simple Guide to the Most Misunderstood Country on Earth by Noa Tishby. Tishby's account is a concise, easy to read history of Jews in Palestine prior to the 1948 founding of the State of Israel and the history to the present day. The book and the clergy provided factual information refuting inaccurate assumptions often made about Israel's existence in the region and its responsibility in the ongoing Israel-Gaza war. 

## Inspired. Proud. Encouraged

But mostly, hopeful for our future. Our nation's future. Our synagogue's future. The future of the Jewish people.

That is exactly how I felt after I, along with Paul Weiner, returned from taking 8 of our amazing teens to L'Taken in mid January. L'Taken is a Social Justice Seminar put on by the RAC, the Religious Action Center of Reform Judaism (a joint program of the Union for Reform Judaism and the Central Conference of American Rabbis). For 4 days, Jewish teens across the United States gather in Washington, D.C., where they are exposed to a variety of

public policy issues, such as gun violence prevention, mental health reform, LGBTQ+ rights, Israel, antisemitism, reproductive rights and more. They look at these issues through the lens of the Jewish values that inform the Reform Movement's advocacy. Throughout the weekend the teens acquire the knowledge and tools to write an effective, persuasive and passionate speech on a topic meaningful to

them to present to their representatives when they visit Capitol Hill on the final day of the seminar.

We are proud to be a part of this effort to teach Jewish advocacy. What the RAC offers is a unique experience for future leaders. The ultimate goal is not to encourage one side or the other, but to teach our teens how to develop strong, effective arguments, weaving in Jewish values. We want them to see how they can view every aspect of their lives through a Jewish lens.

L'Taken is a singular experience. It is just one weekend in a year. The values modeled at L'Taken can be seen in all of our students throughout the year here at home. On a daily basis, we see our students living their best Jewish lives. It's by singing "David Melech Israel," with the hand signs and all. It is by playing a role in a Jewish lifecycle skit. It's making challah. It is just by showing up on Sunday mornings for religious school. All of our students are truly extraordinary in modeling Jewish values. I have so much hope and feel so much pride in what I see and I hope you see it too.

# UNIONGRAMS

Uniongrams have been a part of WRJ since its inception. The women of the National Federation of Temple Sisterhood's (now WRJ) recognized the importance of connecting with family, friends, and their congregational family. The Uniongram gives us a way to congratulate members of our congregational family for important life cycle events such as anniversaries, birthdays, B'nai Mitzvah, weddings, baby namings, confirmations and conversions. Uniongram cards are also a way to recognize someone during the Jewish Holidays. Uniongrams were once referred to as "a Jewish message for a Jewish people."

Uniongrams have a long-standing history at Ohef Sholom Temple. Many congregants of OST use the Uniongram list that is included in the Temple Post as a vehicle to communicate with fellow congregants and share in their Simchas.

The funds collected from the Uniongram program go the Women of Reform Judaism's YES Fund. The YES Fund (Youth, Education and Special Projects Fund) provides grants for rabbinical, cantorial, and camp scholarships. We provided scholarships for girls to attend the URJ Sci-Tech Academy Camp. We funded NFTY for our temple youth. During the pandemic, our Mid-Atlantic District of WRJ provided the funds through our YES Fund donations for the students at the Leo Beck Education Center in Haifa to have laptop computers to continue learning at home. The More Than a Party Project has enabled unaffiliated girls and their mothers in Israel to study to become a Bat

unaffiliated girls and their mothers in Israel to study to become a Bat Mitzvah. WRJ's new Diversity, Equity & Inclusion (DEI) area of support provided funds for LUNAR: The Jewish-Asian Film Project. This list is only a small example of the wonderful things that the YES Fund does and has done over time. We need to support the projects of the YES Fund by continuing to support our OST Uniongram program. The YES Fund grants continue to make a difference in the lives of many people in North America, Israel and around the world.


certificate from 1878, signed by the congregation's second rabbi, English-born Bernard Eberson, who came to OST's pulpit from Troy, New York, in 1877.

The OST Archives houses a Minute Book that dates back to 1867; however, the 1878 certificate may be our oldest document of its kind, and it also may be the only

document in our collection bearing Rabbi Eberson's signature. Although we have not yet been able to decipher the name of the person being confirmed, we hope it will be possible in the future. Regardless, the certificate itself is an invaluable reminder of the rich history of our historic congregation.

# Cetthe Trees at OST

Eco Judaism had been working on a survey of the trees that surround Ohef Sholom Temple. We have identified 29 trees around our impressive building. There are:

9 different species, 5 of which are native. 2 species, the oaks and mulberry have Jewish connections. 7 trees grow on city property.

At this time of year trees are budding out. The buds are swollen and dropping their bud scales, leaves unfold, catkins and flowers appear. Bees and pollinators are seen searching for nectar. Spring happens fast; one day the land under the trees is in full sun and a few days later there is shade. The once bare trees become full of color and activity.

Trees and plants are often used as a metaphor or symbol in Jewish tradition. Examples include The Tree of Life, The Tree of Knowledge, and The Burning Bush. Today trees continue to be important not just for their timeless strength and beauty but also for their contribution to environmental quality and our physical and mental health.

To encourage stewardship and provide more information about trees, Eco Judaism is working on a self-guided tree walk around the building. If anyone would like to participate in this project, please contact the Eco Judaism Committee.
