



From the Clergy

Dear Friends,

The prophet Isaiah speaks of the importance of rejuvenation: "Though you were weary, you did not feel hopeless; because you found renewal of your strength, you were not affected" (Isaiah 57:10). In other words, taking time to care for ourselves isn't just a good idea, it is imperative for our well-being.

Perhaps the most compelling example of this mitzvah in Judaism is that a day of rest each week is built into the fabric of creation. Indeed, the Torah commands that Shabbat is necessary for all God's creatures, even for the land, and, most of all, for human beings. It is far too easy for us to forget this and to keep ourselves so busy with work, school, or whatever else that we never take the moments of quiet and stillness we need to check in with and restore ourselves. Thinking, imagining, creating, connecting . . . all of these require that we stop and rest in order to return to living our best lives. We are, after all, human beings, not human doings.

This past July, I was able to do just this, to take a month long Sabbatical just to be. The time enabled me to turn off my phone and my brain, to breathe deeply and move gently and sleep soundly, and to reflect in a truly restorative way. I returned to Ohef Sholom a better version of myself – happier, calmer, more productive, and able to do really good spiritual work as your rabbi.

We will all have the opportunity to do this over our High Holidays, which begin the month before Rosh Hashana in Elul, on August 25th. Rather than leaving the work of Teshuvah, repentance, renewal and return, to the Days of Awe, we have an entire month dedicated to preparing our hearts and souls. By the time the New Year arrives, we can spend our days together in temple looking forward to the possibilities that lie ahead rather than ruminating over the regrets now behind us.

This is a very special year for Ohef Sholom as we celebrate our twentieth anniversary as rabbi and congregation. What an amazing journey it has been! There are so many memories to cherish and so many more yet to be made. Just as it had done these past two decades, together may our Jewish community help us to navigate the complexities of our world and lives, to find joy, meaning, and fulfillment in moments, even as we wrestle with our struggles and mourn our losses. Our Shabbat service on June 6th reflected all of these triumphs. So, too, will our family Havdallah on November 2nd and Gala dinner on May 9th afford us more chances for personal and communal renewal as we come together to celebrate "we of Ohef Sholom" and what a truly special community we are. I look forward to being with you at all of these occasions and more for many, many years to come.

So let me take this time to wish each of you, your families, and all the world a Happy New Year filled with sweetness, health, wholeness and peace.



As we begin the 2025-26 session of religious school, it seems appropriate to look back at our religious school history. One source of information is the 1915-26 record book kept by "Sabbath School" administrator, Mildred Baum, and the OST Archives, the citadel of our history, has preserved her words. The indomitable Mrs. Baum recorded names of teachers and students and the subject matter for each class.

Classes were held on Saturdays, not Sundays, and the year usually started in October immediately after Sukkot and ended in June. The curriculum seems different too, many classes studying scripture -- from Bible stories to liturgy, but no mention of Hebrew.

By contrast some things look the same. Tzedakah is mentioned frequently: in 1916, \$16.95 collected for "Polish children" suffering through the European War." And two years later, "10.00 for the "welfare of enlisted

men, \$6.00 for Jewish relief, and \$33.75 for cheer of [the] wounded in the government hospital" [Portsmouth Naval Hospital].

In the fall of 1916, she explains there was no sukkah built "as in previous years, because we are without a permanent sabbath school building, the temple having ... burned last February." In fact, the electrical fire that destroyed the magnificent temple on Monticello Avenue started right after classes had ended.

But reminiscent of our recent pandemic experience, in 1918 school "began in October but was closed for three weeks on account of [the] Spanish Influenza epidemic. In November, the Sabbath School was closed again for the same cause."

And many names seem familiar, among them: Hoffheimer, Lowenberg, Levy, Herschler, Mansbach, Pincas, and lots of others, like the name of the two students pictured here. Elise and Loren Nusbaum, who in 1915, were in 3rd grade and the "Infant class" respectively.



destroy fruit trees in the course of laying siege to a city. The prohibition is a very narrow one; the verses go on to state that other trees that are not fruitbearing can be destroyed.

It wasn't long before the rabbis began expanding this idea. The Babylonian Talmud goes beyond warfare to prohibit wasting lamp oil, tearing clothes, chopping up furniture for firewood or killing animals.

When we look around us today we see tremendous amounts of waste and destruction. One very common form of waste that all of us can easily do something about is food waste. According to the USDA, it is estimated that 30-40 percent of the food supply in the U.S. is wasted. This waste occurs at every level of the food system, with a shocking 31 percent occurring at the retail and consumer level. At the retail level there are problems with equipment malfunctions, over-ordering and culling of blemished but edible produce.

We also contribute to food waste when we buy or cook more than we need and then throw out the rest of it. We can make a change in our behavior and help mitigate a host of social and environmental issues by keeping Bal Tashchit in mind when we make up our grocery lists. For these High Holy Days, let's make that effort to not destroy or waste.
