From the Clergy

As we prepare to kindle the lights of Chanukah, we are reminded that light is not only something we see. It's something we create together. A single candle can pierce the darkness, but it is when we gather many flames that the room truly glows.

Over the High Holidays, we talked about collective effervescence — that electric sense of joy and connection that arises when people come together with shared purpose. We felt it on Simchat Torah, when we unfurled our Torah scrolls around the sanctuary and blessed our Consecration students while literally surrounded by sacred words and by one another. We felt it again when we gathered for Havdallah to mark the release of the hostages. As we lifted the braided candle high, we joined in a sacred act of separation: setting apart the darkness of the past two years from the light of hope that returned with them. The intertwined wicks of the candle symbolized what we already knew in our hearts — that our light shines the brightest when it is joined with others.

At Ohef Sholom, we are blessed with countless opportunities to experience that illumination. In song, in prayer, in celebration, and even in shared grief, we rediscover the radiant truth that no one's flame must burn alone. This is what our congregation offers: a place to gather, to kindle hope, to reflect light outward into a world that so desperately needs it.

May this Chanukah season remind us that while darkness is inevitable, despair is not. When we come together, our collective light becomes something sacred, something joyful, something that can truly transform the night.

A message from First Vice President Andy Fox

In the Spirit of Banana Ball

Once again, I find myself in post-High Holiday bliss, refreshed and inspired for another incredible OST year. Whether you joined in person or online, or have it on your to-do list to watch the videos, I know all will agree that we continue to raise the bar in terms of transcendent, joyous, and secure HHD worship and other observances. It can never be said enough, THANK YOU Rabbi, Cantor, Chuck, our incredible Choir, Temple Staff, and an army of volunteers who make it all possible.

Like many of you, I did not come to Yom Kippur morning services expecting to hear about "Banana Ball," the unique brand of baseball beloved by millions of fans every summer. Like any excellent sermon, Cantor Jen's d'var got me thinking. Banana Ball is an incredible phenomenon. The players are entertainers but are also incredibly talented at the sport, the games are exciting down to the last out, and everyone is in on the fun including the umpires, the "benchwarmers," and, most importantly, the crowd. With apologies to the baseball purists among us, at heart, it's baseball - but fun. Without records, standings, playoffs, or a storied history, Banana Ball teams sell out Major League stadiums in minutes all summer long with resale tickets costing hundreds of dollars. How is this possible, and what can we learn from it?

In many ways, Judaism is the baseball of the western religions - the oldest and most traditional, one that most resembles in many ways the earliest days of the sport. There are reams of official rules and dozens of unwritten rules, all grounded in concepts of respect for tradition and reverence for the past. For decades, critics have argued that these rules and traditions render baseball uninteresting, inaccessible, and, yes, boring to new generations of fans. By contrast, founder Jesse Cole (unavoidable on social media in his trademark bright yellow tuxedo and bowler hat) designed Banana Ball from the ground up for fan enjoyment and engagement. Here are just a few examples of this:

Every aspect of Banana Ball is a celebration of the sport and of life. From the moment you enter the stadium grounds, there is a party atmosphere with live music, games, and opportunities to meet and interact with the players. Trick plays, bat flips, and, yes, both spontaneous and intricately planned dancing are key parts of the experience.

Despite the shenanigans, the on-field product is of the highest quality. Competition to play for a Banana Ball team is incredibly fierce, with players possessing both professional-level baseball talent and the ability to entertain and connect with fans. The players obviously love playing baseball and the love is infectious specifically and importantly, love for the game itself.

There are several Banana Ball rules that depart from those of traditional baseball, and which are designed to improve the pace of play and enhance fan enjoyment. The result is an experience that is compact, high energy, and, as Cantor Jen described, "spontaneously effervescent."

We of Ohef Sholom Temple share many similarities with Banana Ball - we celebrate unabashedly, poke a little fun at ourselves, and enjoy the absolute highest quality Jewish experience through our worship, music, education, and engagement programs (and we've really been filling those seats, too!). We've also looked at a few rules over the years and decided that we can depart from them and still honor our traditions and enhance our "love of the game," even as we welcome new members and generations to our temple family.

Perhaps most relevant to our faith, in Banana Ball, a team is never out of the game. Each inning is a minigame in which the team scoring the most runs gets a single point - until the ninth inning, where every run counts. It's never too late for a team to reach deep, put out its best effort, and make a comeback. Similarly, our recent season of T'shuvah provided each of us an opportunity for change and renewal as we put the past behind us and turn the page to a new year.

I'll close by asking the same question Jesse Cole asked himself when he envisioned Banana Ball: we have a great thing - how can we make it better? More engaging? More inclusive? More joyous? Send your suggestions to ed@ohefsholom.org with the subject line Banana Ball. If we get enough

responses, you may just see me in a yellow tuxedo.

TURN IT OFF

This may seem like an odd title for an article that is being published in time for Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights, but the short days and long nights are a good time to consider light pollution. Light pollution effects plants, animals, the environment, and our power bills. Jewish days begin at sunset. Night is considered to be a time to prepare for the coming daylight and to rest. Days end in the evening when 3

bright stars can be seen.

Our use of artificial lighting has allowed us to use the dark hours in ways that our ancestors would never have imagined. Many of our uses of lighting have interrupted the circadian rhythm of the natural world. Outdoor lighting in particular has a negative impact on both plants and animals. Sea turtle hatchlings get turned around by artificial lights and don't get to the water. Bird migration is disrupted by the lights from cities resulting in many birds flying into windows or disorienting flocks. Mammals are drawn toward the lights and can become nuisance animals. Nocturnal insect pollinators are drawn to the lights instead of pollinating plants. The excessive light does not give plants time to store the nutrients that they will need for future growth.

There are steps that we can take to limit light pollution.

- \chi use light sensors
- use light covers that direct the light down
- choose colored lights that do not attract animals
- 🔭 use fewer lights
- \chi close curtains to keep indoor light inside
- * TURN IT OFF whether indoors or outdoors unless needed

Bal Tashchit tells us "Though shalt not waste or destroy". Decreasing light pollution can be our Hanukkah gift for our earth.

ILLUMINATION IN THE A Special Menorah and a Special Prayer

Archives primarily focus on documents, photographs, audio/visual materials, and digital records. However, many archives, including the OST Archive, also contain a limited number of unusual artifacts. A beautiful little oil lamp, currently on display in the OST lobby, is a fine example of this. The lamp was made i Israel and donated by Thais Kaufmann, of blessed memory.

The lamp is a special type of menorah called a chanukiyah.
The Hebrew word menorah means lamp and refers to the seven-branched candelabrum (or lampstand) in the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. By contrast, a chanukiyah has nine branches and is specifically designed for use during the holiday of Chanukah. As the website myjewishlearning.com explains, "every chanukiyah is a menorah, but not every menorah is a chanukiyah."

That our lamp is a chanukiyah is substantiated by the fact that it has spaces for nine wicks. Additionally, the Hebrew words engraved on it make that clear. The first word (נוֹר) – seen on the lamp without the vowel – is a variation of the word for light, and the second word (תובבה) – also seen on the lamp without

vowels - means Chanukaĥ.

As we approach the holiday this year, we hope you'll take a few minutes to view the oil lamp and the beautiful Chanukah prayer written by Rabbi Louis Mendoza, which is also on display. Mendoza was OST's longest serving rabbi, having led the congregation from 1907 to 1945. Known for his eloquence, this rare surviving example of his writing extends the hope that just as the lights of Chanukah grow in number, so will we all "grow in knowledge and . . . goodness, in gratitude to [God], in love and respect for our parents and teachers, [and] in kindness and helpfulness to all our fellow-beings." Happy Chanukah from the volunteers of the OST Archive!



LIGHTING THE CHANUKIYAH



Light the shamash (helper candle) first, and use it to light the rest of the Chanukah candles. As you do, speak or sing the Chanukah blessings

Remember, the newest candle is always lit first. The candles are added to your chanukiyah from right to left, but are lit from left to right. When celebrating Shabbat and Chanukah, kindle the Shabbat candles after lighting your menorah.
